**CHILD SPEECH CENTER AUTHORIZED FOR OCE MONMOUTH**—A Cooperative Speech and Hearing Rehabilitation Center was authorized by the Oregon State Board of Higher Education recently for Oregon College of Education. Similar centers will be established also at the other two colleges of education.

This center is to be conducted with the Special Educational division of the State Department of Education. It will serve handicapped children in this geographical area through the treatment of children with speech difficulties, especially those associated with cleft palate and cerebral palsy cases.

### COMPENSATION BOOSTS

More than 3,000,000 veterans and dependents of deceased veterans will receive increases in compensation and pension payment by virtue of Public Law 356, 82d Congress, approved May 23. The increases became effective July 1, and will be included in checks which will be mailed at the end of July, according to the Veterans Administration.

A companion measure, Public Law 357, 82d Congress, was also approved on May 23, increasing the amount of income a person may have and still be eligible for pension payments in non-service connected disability and death cases.

## Worth Repeating

The Administration has been maintaining a press agent staff of 3,632 to publicize Federal activities at an annual cost of \$17,134,390.

The Federal government amassed \$7,756,000,000 in unexpended employment security trust funds, but has used the money for ordinary expenses, and the fund is now represented by government bonds which are obligations against the taxpayers.

The average American employee pays more than one day's pay per week in direct and indirect taxes to the Federal government.

One Federal personnel worker, according to Senator Johnston of South Carolina, says the red tape involved in laying off a civilian employee costs more than it does to keep him on the payroll.

Continued defense spending at present rates can bankrupt the nation, the House Armed Services Committee warned recently.

In one month a meat packing company paid out \$200,000 in overtime to clerical workers sorting over OPS records, although 90 percent of the plant's products were selling below ceiling prices.

## ENGINEER RESERVISTS ARE OFFERED TRAINING

Army reservists of the Engineer and Ordnance Corps may apply for specialist training in many fields. Courses are from five to ten weeks duration. Instruction will be given at Fort Belvoir, Virginia; Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri; and Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland.

Engineers are offered courses in air compressor, mason, electrician, general carpenter, plumber, heavy construction, structural steel, tractor scraper and general utility repair.
