Some Main Dish Recipes That Save Money, Time And Effort

HERE'S another batch of money, time and effort-saving recipes, so important just now, made so by using condensed soup as a main ingredient.

Sunday supper special at one house we know is a delicious meat pie. To make it, cook 4 tbsp. chopped onion in tsp. butter until soft. Add one lb. ground beef and cook until barely brown. Blend in one can condensed tomato soup; add 1/2 tsp. salt, 1/2 tsp. pepper, mixing well. Line a 9-inch pastry plate with pie pastry, moistening edges with cold water. Fill with meat mixture, cover with top crust and bake at 375 F. for one hour. Serves 6-8.

If the icebox yields enough for 2 c. cooked ground meat (chicken, lamb, beef, veal or ham) then you've the basis for a fine luncheon dish. Mix the ground meat with one can cream of mushroom soup, then spread mixture between bread slices. Dip the sandwiches in a mixture of one beaten egg, 1/2 c. milk, salt and pepper

to suit, and brown on both sides in butter.

Here is a casserole dish that is different, and is it good! To serve 5-6, cut 3/4 c. diced, cooked chicken and 1/2 c. diced ham in 1/4-inch lengths. Combine with one c. chicken gumbo soup, 2 c. cooked rice and 2 tbsp. chopped pimiento. Mix thoroughly and place in individual casseroles. Place a pineapple ring on top of each, and over each ring sprinkle tsp. brown sugar, dot with tsp. butter and put in 3 cloves. Bake at 375 F. for 20-25 min., or until pineapple is glazed.

Salmon Loaf with a clam chowder sauce is mighty fine fare on Friday or any other day, for that matter. To serve 6, drain one can salmon, pick out the bones and dark skin. Mash, and combine with 1 1/2 c. soft bread crumbs or 3/4 c. dry fine bread crumbs, 2 tbsp. melted butter, one can tomato soup and 2 slightly-beaten eggs. Place mixture in a buttered loaf pan, and bake at 350 F. for 45-60 min. To prepare the sauce, add 1/2 c. milk or cream to one can clam chowder; heat, don't boil.

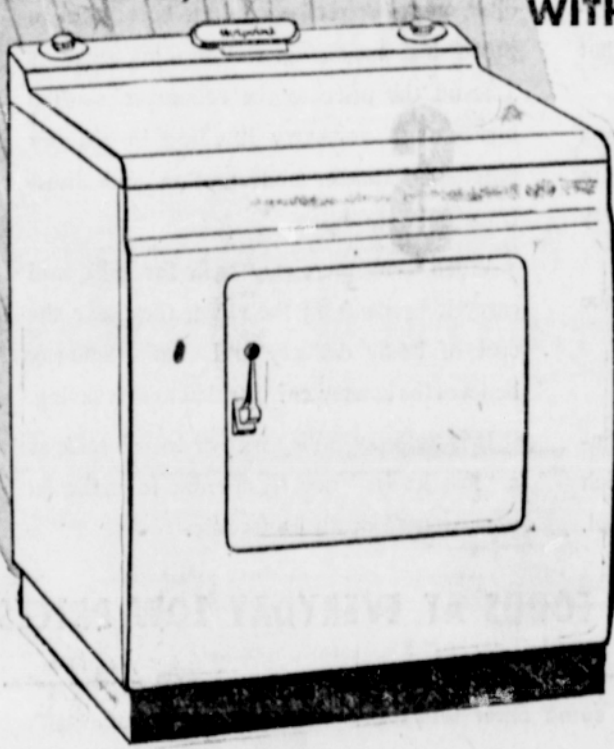
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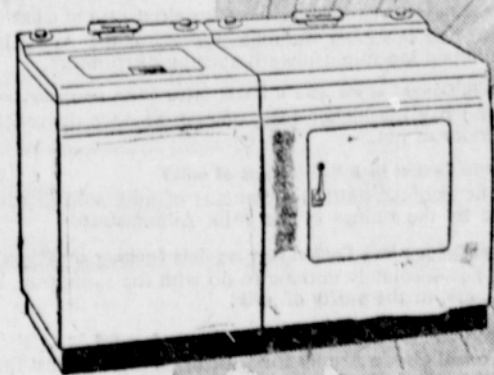
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
