

Pastor Raymond Cales Speaks at SDA Statewide Convocation at Gladstone

Pastor Raymond Cales of the Cottage Grove Seventh-day Adventist church, who is chairman of press relations of the statewide convocation being held at Gladstone Park thru Sunday, July 27, told the group that "Our people believe in loyal service to their country." He continued, "During World War II we trained more than 10,000 medical soldiers from among our young men who served in the Army Medical Corps. They went unarmed under heavy fire to care for the wounded and dying."

Corporal Desmond Doss, the hero of Okinawa, a Seventh-day Adventist medical soldier, was decorated with the Congressional Medal of Honor by President Truman.

A Red Cross Bloodmobile functioned at the Gladstone Park Camp grounds July 20 and 21 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Last year approximately 400 pints of blood were donated by the campers, and an even larger response was given this year.

Ship Clothing Overseas

J. Ernest Edwards, associate world secretary of Relief and Welfare work of Seventh-day Adventists, told visitors at Gladstone Park camp meeting Friday, that during the past five years the Adventist welfare societies have shipped three million pounds of clothes to needy and destitute people overseas, in 20 countries.

"We are specializing in Korean relief at the present time," Mr. Edwards said, "having sent 15,000 pounds there a few weeks ago. We are also sending CARE packages in addition to clothes."

Three months ago Mr. Edwards had an opportunity to see relief work on the receiving end, following the recent hurricane and earthquake in Haiti and Salvador.

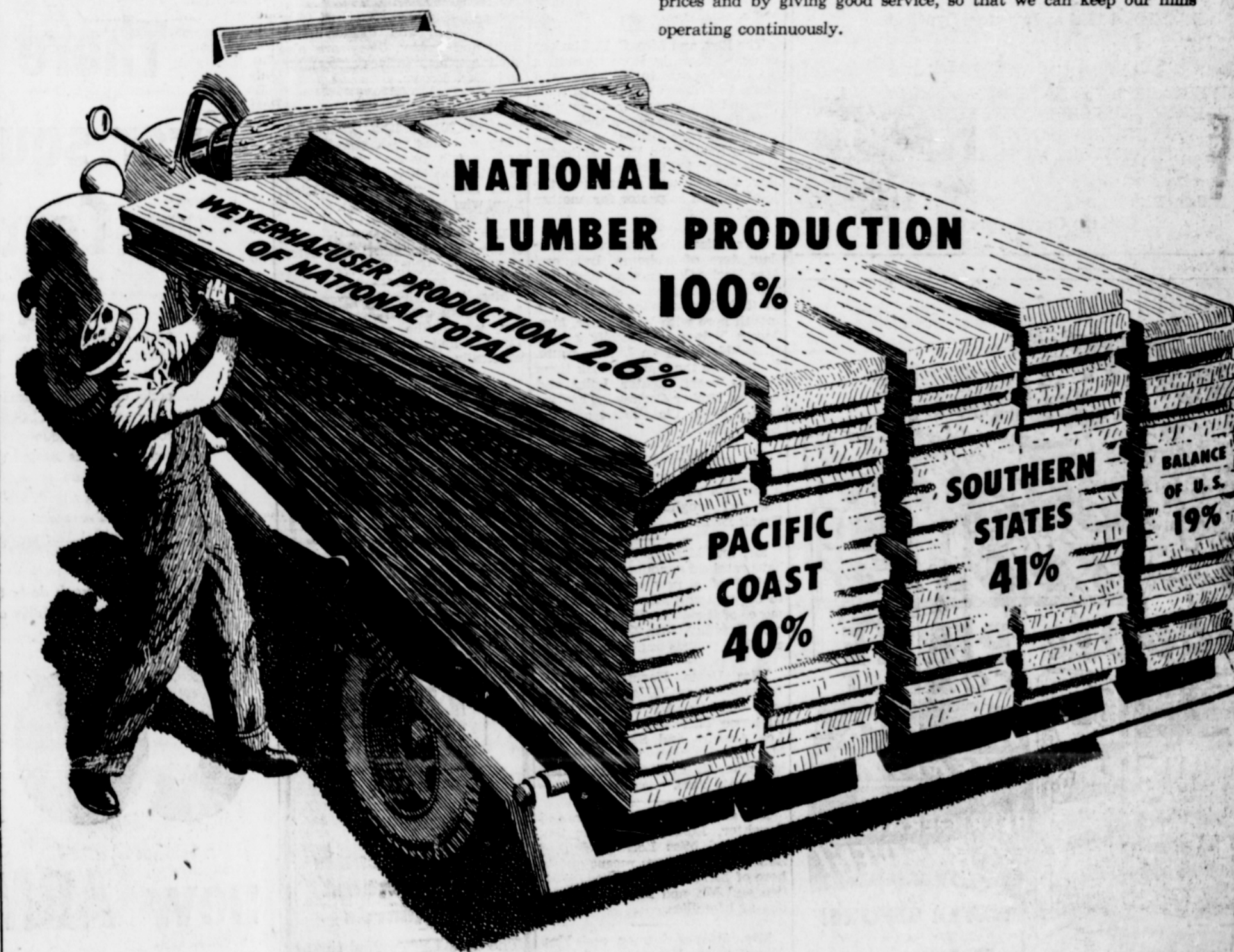
