National Guard Hits High Peak

Washington, D. C.—The Army National Guard is almost 100 percent organized, Major General Raymond H. Fleming, Chief of the National Guard Bureau, has announced. Approximately 98 percent of the more than 5,200 Army units currently allotted the states and territories have been organized and federally recognized. An additional 28 units have been authorized to organize.

Citing the Guard record, General Fleming pointed out that approximately 1,700 Army Guard units, with about 120,000 officers and men, have been called to active military service during the present emergency. A number of company and battalion-size units already have returned to state control. These include anti-aircraft artillery, field artillery, military police, medical and tank and engineer units.

"With the experience and training received in combat in Korea, on active military service, and in training at home, the National Guard today is at the highest state

Steel Strike Cuts Into Auto Output

Automobile production during the first six months of this year was only two-thirds of what it was during the same period last year, the Oregon State Motor Association has reported.

The reason, of course, was the steel strike. Steel shortages brought plant shutdowns throughout the country. One industry spokesman predicted that only a handful of producers would be able to continue making automobiles and parts during August. Since that announcement, however the strike has been settled and the picture looks better, the Oregon AAA club pointed out.

Total passenger car production for the first six months of 1952 was 2,278,695, while the number produced in the same period in 1951 was 3,388,289—an all-time record.

HIWAY MAN PROMOTED

George V. Miller, who has served as a paving inspector for the Highway Department for the larger part of the period from 1919 to now, was advanced to the new position of chief paving inspector as of August 1, according to an announcement by the commission. "His record of readiness for any contingency in its peacetime history," said General Fleming.

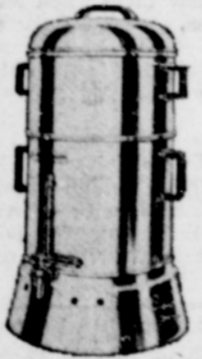
