## Lions Football Season Starts As Practice Is Called 25th; Murray Announces Schedule

Football, synonymous with the fall season, is just around the corner, with the first big practice for the Cottage Grove high school Lions set for Monday, August 25 at the field.

New coach Max Murray has sent out a call to varsity, start, ball reception, passing and kicking.

Assisting Murray with the team are Wally Johnson, newly from Oakridge, as assistant coach and Wally Cochetti as line coach. Dusenberry will act as team trainer and manager.

The boys will see first play in the Lane County fourth annual football jamboree September 6 at Civic Stadium in Eugene, Springfield and Oakridge are newcomers to the jamboree, which will mean that the eight teams will play only one 12-minute quarter instead of two as before. Other schools entering the play besides Eugene and Cottage Grove are University, Junction City, Willamette and St. Francis.

## Hill-Gasper Win 2-Ball Foursome

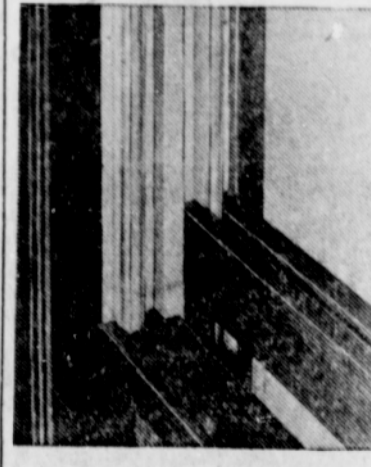
