SCHOOL DATES ARE SET FOR MILK INSPECTORS

All fluid milk inspectors in Oregon will go to school on December 1, 2 and 3 and, what's more, if they don't make satisfactory marks upon completion of the course the state won't permit them to continue as fluid milk inspectors.

This school is an innovation created under the 1951 Oregon fluid milk act which the state department of agriculture administers. The department has just announced the dates for the first school, and these will be permanent days for the annual course of instruction and ensuing examinations.

The school will be held on the Oregon State college campus under the joint sponsorship of the department's division of foods and dairies and the college's dairy department.

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Archers to Open Hunt Season 13th

Oregon's bow and arrow clan will begin its deer and elk season at sunrise, Saturday, September 13, in five archery areas: Mt. Emily (Union and Umatilla counties), Canyon Creek (Grant county), Cow Creek (Douglas county), Hart Mountain (Lake county), Tillamook (Tillamook county), and Clatskanie (Columbia county).

The choice of archery hunting areas is the largest since archery seasons were initiated in 1935 with the establishment of the Canyon Creek archery area. It is believed archers will number nearly 3000 this year, well surpassing last year's total of 1655.

Bag limit in the archery areas is one deer of either sex, and in Mt. Emily and Canyon Creek areas one elk of either sex may also be taken.

Trash Fish Purging Scheduled at McKay

McKay reservoir in Umatilla county will be purged of trash fish this fall providing there is adequate draw-down of the reservoir waters, according to Northeast Oregon Game Supervisor Bill Brown.

The large man-made lake between Pendleton and Pilot Rock is populated with trash fish including suckers, chiselmouth, and carp, and a stunted population of bullheads and crappie. At maturity the crappie are only six inches in length. Following treatment of the reservoir waters with rotenone to kill the present fish population, a plant of rainbow trout fry would be made.

Investigations by Fishery Agent Homer Campbell show that the reservoir is well suited to trout, but past rainbow plants of legal length in competition with the overabundant trash fish have provided little fishing.
