Recently Remodeled Gierau's Market Announces Grand Opening Nov 7-8

Gierau's Market on West Main street, which has recently completed a remodeling job inside and out, will hold its grand opening Friday and Saturday.

Part of the opening will be giving away of free groceries and treats for the kids and the serving of refreshments.

Gierau's remodeled the building after the grocery and meat market had been there about two years. Long, tubular fluorescent lights running thru the center of the ceiling add light. The walls are of an attractive light and dark green and brick red, each one painted a different color.

New additions are self service, refrigerated produce counters, dairy and ice cream cases. Frozen food case, new center aisle shelves for canned goods are also new, as are the hardware, drug and school supply racks. A double check-out stand aids customers.

The new floor is of asphalt tile. A total of 24 feet has been added to the length of the store.

Franklin's meat market features a new self service case and also service cases.

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Change in Social Security Permits Earnings to \$75

Every person receiving monthly payments under the old-age and survivors insurance system of the Social Security Act will be interested in knowing that beginning with September, they may earn as much as \$75.00 per month and still accept their benefit payment checks.

Claude E. Dawson, manager of the Eugene social security office, states that amendments to the Social Security Act in 1952 provide that persons receiving social security must now have their payments suspended the very first month they work and earn wages of more than \$75.00 in employment covered by the Social Security Act. The procedure for persons who are self-employed is slightly different. Here too, they are not entitled to social security payments if they earn over \$75.00 per month; but since their coverage under the law is based on the net profit from their business, they may have a net for the year of \$900.00 before they suffer a loss of monthly social security benefits.

The only exception is the 75-year old beneficiary. Once a person attains age 75, he can receive monthly social security benefits regardless of how much he earns.

Some folks, Dawson continued, have expressed the opinion that social security benefits should be paid at age 65 regardless of whether the individual has retired. In other words, they feel

The only answer to that question, Dawson states, is to remember that the present social security program was designed to provide protection against the hazard of loss of income due to old-age and death. In other words, an insurance system to provide protection only at the time of retirement or to survivors of a deceased worker. Old-Age and survivors insurance is not an annuity insurance program.
