
way until after the high school carnival this week end. Campbell said he hoped to have about 55 candidates to report for practice. Following is the schedule of the season:

Lions Win Final Game at Currin Field Score 7-0

The Cottage Grove Lions ended the 1952 football season by chalking up a 7 to 0 victory over the visiting Lebanon warriors in a fog shrouded game at Currin field Friday night.

Spectators had a real chore in trying to follow the game where most of the time the players were enveloped in a fog. Visibility was zero in the lower stands and it was only those in the lower stands who could follow the game with any degree of accuracy and only then if the teams were near midfield.

But the fog was good for passing and Lowell Radway, Grove speedster, made the most of it. Radway passed to a total of 101 yards; one to a TD which came after the first quarter whistle and another which counted in the third quarter.

The Lions cashed in on a Lebanon fumble in the third quarter. After the fog obscured Lion recovered the fumble, Radway hit Ken Sloan for 22 yards. Joel Pynch ran four yards on the next down, then Radway connected with J. Wilson for the TD. Marvin Hayes ran the extra point.

The TD was the main activity for the remainder of the game. Both teams got within 15 yards of scoring earlier, but this was all.

MILITARY DETECTIVE SCHOOL FOR RESERVISTS

Advance schooling for military police criminal investigators has been instituted by the Provost Marshal General. A six-weeks criminal investigations advanced course is now being given at the Provost Marshal General school, Camp Gordon, Ga.

A new course will be open only to officers, warrant officers and master sergeants who have been accredited as criminal investigators by the Provost Marshal General. They have completed criminal investigation courses and have had a minimum of three years experience as accredited investigators. Qualified reservists interested in this course are invited to correspond with their military district headquarters for further details.

O&C NOVEMBER TIMBER SALES LISTED BY BLM

Roscoe E. Bell, regional administrator of the BLM announces that seven tracts of O & C stumpage will be offered for sale in November. The tracts with 14,350,000 board feet are appraised at \$267,301.75.

On November 17 one tract with 1,885,000 board feet will be offered at Medford by sealed bid. Also on November 17 the Salem district of the BLM will seek to sell three tracts with 750,000 board feet by oral bids. In Coos Bay on November 18 two tracts with 10,785,000 bd. ft. will be placed on the block for oral bids. The Eugene district will offer 750,000 board feet by oral bids on November 19.

70 Fires Reported in Elk Hunt Area

Elk hunters in eastern Oregon failed to maintain the excellent fire-prevention record posted by deer hunters last month. More than 70 fires have been reported on national forest land in the first four days of the season which opened November 1. Forest Service officials have revealed.

Most of the fires are resulting from warming fires abandoned by thoughtless hunters whose vigilance has been lulled by recent showers and cool nights. Untended campfires and carelessly discarded smokes are also taking their toll.

42 KILLED IN OREGON IN OCTOBER ACCIDENTS

Traffic accidents claimed 42 lives in Oregon last month, and state traffic authorities held out little promise of any material reduction in the death toll by year's end.

The 42 October deaths bring fatalities for the year to date to 360, just seven fewer than the number recorded at the same time a year ago. October's count may go higher if delayed death notices and accident reports are received.

Monthly traffic deaths have reached 40 or more for five consecutive months beginning in June, the secretary of state's office reported. Peak traffic killing came in August when 50 persons were listed as victims of fatal accidents.
