'Youth Views News' H. S. Broadcast Set

"Youth Views the News" will be recorded from the auditorium of Cottage Grove High and broadcast over a coast network in March.

The invitation to participate in the program has been received from station KOMO in Seattle, according to Mr. Robert Dusenberry.

Three current news topics will be submitted to the school the Monday before the broadcast. These topics will be studied in the social science classes during the week. On Friday, March 6, at a morning assembly the program will be recorded.

A panel of four students will present the students' views of the news. A traveling mike will be then used to get reactions of others in the ASB.

The program will be presented the following Sunday, March 8, at 6:30 p.m. over a network of eleven radio stations in Oregon and Washington. KERG in Eugene and KGW in Portland are two of the radio stations that present this program in Oregon.

This public service program is sponsored by the Weyerhaeuser Timber Company. Other schools in this area that have participated are Eugene High and Springfield High. The program has won several awards in the past.
