U. S. Pacific Fleet (Delayed)—Returning to the United States aboard the attack carrier USS Princeton recently was Charles L. McMillan, seaman, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. B. McMillan of Cottage Grove.

The Princeton had eight months of combat duty in Korea, and its planes participated in some of the most spectacular air raids of the Korean conflict.

They blew up the important Sihuo Dam close by the Manchurian border, were the first to attack through the heavy flak at Pyongyang, at Kowon and at vital power plants just south of the Yalu River.

They gave close air support to UN troops at White Horse Mountain, Chorwon, and Sniper Ridge. The ship received high praise from Commander Naval Forces Far East.

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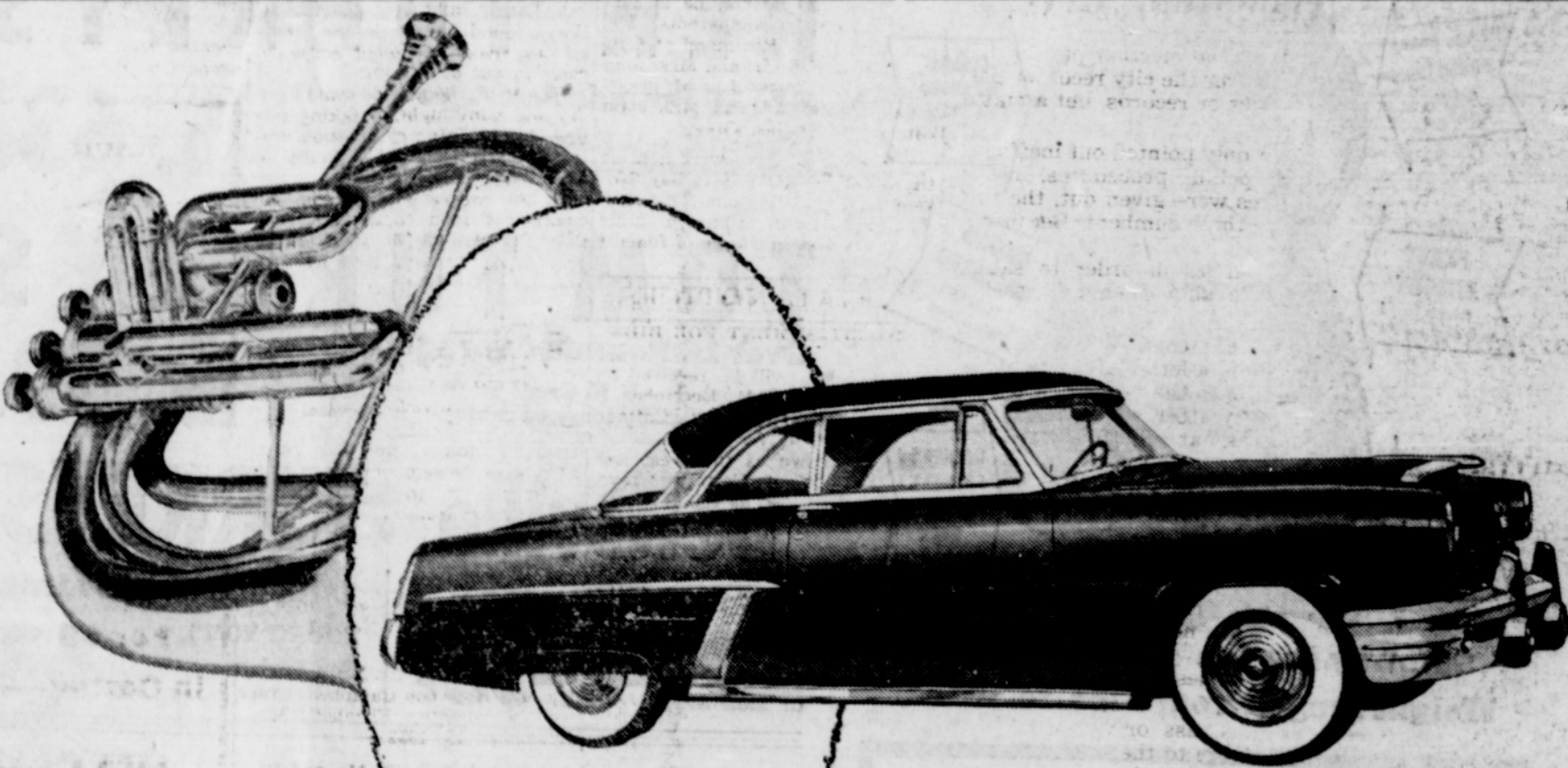
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
