#### John Lund Enjoys CG News

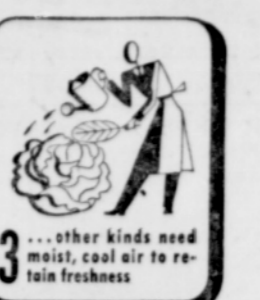
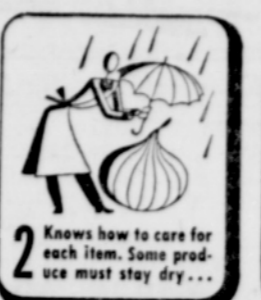

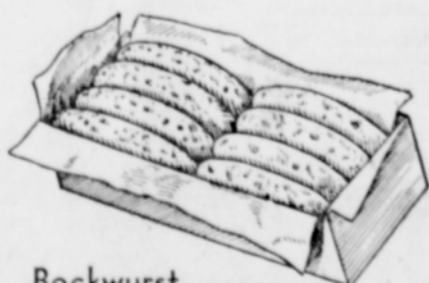
