Soloist Jimmy Grewelle sang "Betchus" and "The Lord's Prayer," accompanied by Mrs. Boyd Allen, church organist. Mrs. Allen also played the traditional wedding marches.

The bride was escorted to the altar by her father. Her gown was of white ivory satin with sweetheart neckline and semi-train. She carried a shower bouquet of white stock and small yellow rosebuds.

For "something borrowed," the bride wore a strand of pearls that were her mother's, and for "something old," she carried a handkerchief of the bridegroom's grandmother.
