Members of the Past Matrons club will be entertained by Mrs. Charles Hall at 1:30 p.m. April 12.

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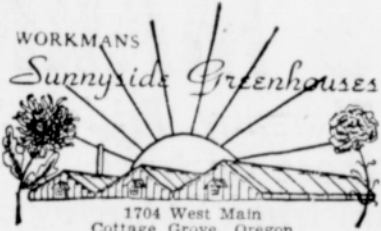

Elmira Montgomery Reaches 100th Year On April Fool's Day

An avalanche of cards, flowers, gifts and callers all reminded Mrs. Elmira Montgomery, affectionately known as "Grandma Montgomery," that she had arrived at her 100th birthday anniversary April 1. She was showered with over 100 cards from relatives and friends.

Also prized among her gifts were an azalea from Kansas; a birthday cake with the inscription "100" baked by her daughter, Mrs. Bert Dawley; a new dress from a daughter-in-law in Kansas; a collar from a granddaughter in Arkansas and a white wool stole and an unusual room decoration with purple yarn from a granddaughter at Fort Worth, Texas.

Grandma Montgomery says that being born on April Fool's day accounts for her sense of humor and that ability to lighten life with an occasional joke has aided her in reaching her 100th milestone.

Mrs. Montgomery, a former Cottage Grove resident, was born April 1, 1854, in Madison county, Indiana. On December 19, 1874, she was married in Belmont, Ill.,

to C. W. Montgomery. She was raised on a farm and knew how to work. Most of her married life was also spent on farms in Illinois, Kansas and at Dorena. Her husband was a veteran of the Civil War, serving with Company H, 58th Illinois Infantry.

In 1937 Mr. and Mrs. Montgomery moved to Dorena, and in 1939 he died at the age of 93 years. Grandma is a member of the Methodist Church. After her husband's death, she moved to Cottage Grove where she maintained her own home and was active until about 95 years old.

Four children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Montgomery: Ed in Denver; Frank, deceased; Mrs. Bert (Clara) Dawley, Cottage Grove, and Bert in Kansas. She also has 17 grandchildren; 27 great-grandchildren and 14 great-great-grandchildren.
