One of the most delightful persons I know laughs at trouble. He's a salesman, calls on me regularly and I'm always glad to see him; so are other people too.

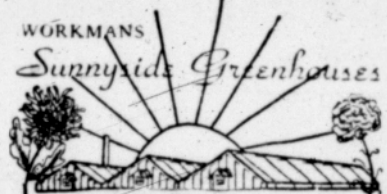
