On May 21, 1954, in the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon, from 8:00 a.m. till 8:00 p.m., a city tax base election will be held at which the following proposition will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Cottage Grove for their approval or rejection:

ESTABLISHING NEW CITY TAX BASE. Shall the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon, increase its tax base from \$34,899.22 to \$110,000.00?

This proposition, if adopted, will establish a new tax base for the City of Cottage Grove, Oregon, for the purpose of applying the limitation on taxation set forth in section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution. The present tax base is \$34,899.22. The new tax base if adopted will be \$110,000.00, and the new tax base if adopted shall first apply to the levy for the fiscal year next following this election.

The city and county precincts within the City of Cottage Grove will have uniform boundaries and the same election boards. The polling places in the city for the city tax base election will be at the same places as provided by Lane County for the state-wide regular primary election to be held on the same day, May 21, 1954, and to such places as the election boards may legally adjourn.

The City Council by ordinance has appointed the identical officers appointed by the County Court of Lane County, Oregon, for the state-wide regular primary election, as the judges and clerks of the city tax base election to serve in each of the polling places in the respective precincts to which they are appointed by the County Court of Lane County.

The following is the Charter Amendment to be voted on.

CHARTER AMENDMENT
AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 5 OF CHAPTER IV OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, LANE

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COUNTY, OREGON, ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OREGON, AND APPROVED BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF OREGON ON THE 20th DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1901, AND ALL AMENDMENTS THEREOF.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, OREGON:

Section 1. That Section 5 of Chapter IV of the Charter of the City of Cottage Grove, enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, and approved by the Governor of the State of Oregon on the 20th day of February, 1901, and all amendments thereto, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 5. The Common Council may impose punishment for breach of any ordinance of the City of Cottage Grove to the extent of a fine not exceeding \$500.00 or by imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

ment, in default of the payment of such fine the convicted person may be imprisoned in the City Jail one day for every \$2.00 of such fine.

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
