Postmaster Urges Rural Mail Route Patrons to Correct Box Irregularities

CRESWELL—The attention of all rural mail route patrons is called by Postmaster W. W. Lowery to Mail Box Improvement week which started Monday, May 17. During the first 15 days in May of each year, postmasters are required to make inspections of rural routes and report to the Post Office Department. Cases where patrons fail to comply with instructions of the postmaster in correcting irregularities in mail boxes, approaches to boxes or other corrections which should be made, must be reported.

Mail matter is one of our most cherished possessions, yet it is alarming to see the condition of some mail boxes which are to receive and protect this same mail matter.

Nearly 40 per cent of our rural mail boxes do not have a name on them or have the name of a former patron. The law says the name of the patron to be served must be in black letters at least one inch high and on the side facing the carrier.

In case of a temporary carrier having to serve a route where there are from 400 to 500 families and the boxes are poorly labeled, it is impossible to give good service.

A notice on Post Office form #4056 is being sent to patrons who have boxes which do not meet requirements. They are urged to read the form in its entirety and make the required correction of the irregularity.
