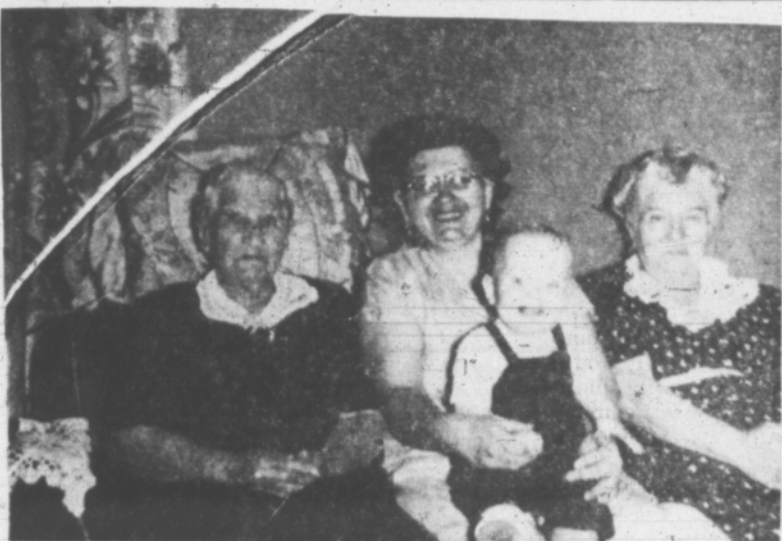

area should profit from the station.

It was the opinion of Councilman Richard Ewing that the pump station would have to be put in some time. He added that in this day and age it seemed unfair to subject people to septic tanks, although he added that it was hard to know where the money was coming from.

Citizens Address Council

Council also heard from three citizens of Cottage Grove who opined that many people in the southeast sector had septic tanks but wanted to get off them. The citizens were of the opinion that the open ditches beyond the school house were a hazard to the health of the children and to the community. They said they were anxious that the conditions in the southeast sector be improved and felt that it shouldn't be neglected for an area not now developed. The citizens were given assurance by the mayor that the council was well-aware of the problem.

In other Council action the members present passed Ordinance 1457 calling for a special election June 25 to enable citizens to vote on the city budget for 1954-55. Voting will be by wards as follows:

Ward 1, Precinct 1—Masonic Temple; Ward 2, Precincts 2 and 3—City Recorder's office in City Hall; Ward 3, Precincts 4 and 5—Pearl Safley residence at 1133 East Main. The polls will be open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Public Necessity
Council pointed out that the election was scheduled because of a public necessity to raise city funds for 1954-55 to meet the city budget.

Ordinance 1456, to authorize the increase in the tax levy, is the measure on which the voters will be voting.

Council also passed Ordinance 1458 which authorized the exchange of property between the city and Mr. and Mrs. H. W. Satterwhite just west of Main Street and the new bridge. Exchange of the property enabled the city to put in the necessary approaches to the bridge from the west.

Council turned back to the City Attorney for additional checking five assessment ordinances (1460, 1461, 1462, 1463 and 1464) for paving done last summer.

Minutes earlier the Council had passed Ordinance 1459 to authorize the right to property on South Sixth street by Jess Lansing, Jr. and Lewis J. Caldwell.

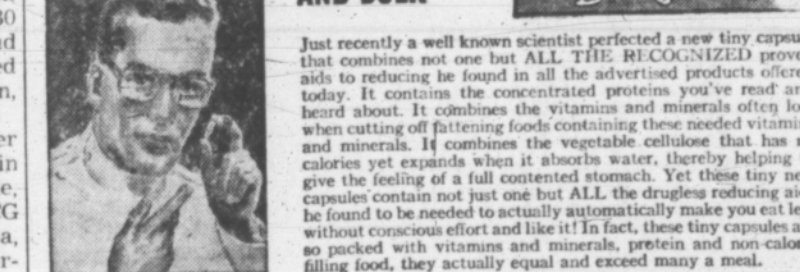

monthly can afford to purchase on these terms.

It is the thought of many local residents that this development will spur home building activities in the area and insure adequate housing for Cottage Grove. Not everybody, they believe, will be satisfied with these homes. Many have a dream home in mind that only a custom builder can satisfy.

They point to the many competent local builders here, who can build at competitive prices and secure competitive terms—and build in any location desired. Such prospects for new homes are urged to get in touch with local builders, for it appears now is a good time to build.

"No Fears of Over-building"
According to Chamber Manager Hiltbrand, there are no fears of overbuilding. "For too long," he says, "we have been 'underbuilt' and people who would have liked to have lived here are paying taxes and buying goods and necessities somewhere else."

The addition of the \$300,000 taxable property to the city tax rolls should be an advantage not to be overlooked, he added. Revenues derived, according to those who have figured it out, should show a profit on necessary expenditures in 5 to 10 years.

This is the biggest home development in Cottage Grove history and compared with a total of \$55,000 spent for new homes erected in the city limits last year. While there has been an acute need of adequate housing in the past, the completion of the Wood and Plywood plant, now being installed, and other developments now in the planning by other concerns call for additional housing.

It is the intention of Slavens Brothers, to employ all the local labor possible; buy concrete mix, sewer, tile, and other supplies needed locally. They employ union labor.

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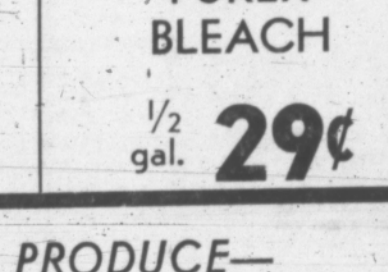
