Sam Swartz Heads New Regional Post Office at Portland

Sam Swartz, who started his postal career here in 1921, will be the head of a new regional post office to be established in Portland soon, Senator Guy Cordon announced Friday. The new regional office will supervise postal operations in Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana and Alaska and is tentatively scheduled to start operations in Portland on June 30. The regional office will supervise the activities of district offices to be established in Spokane, Seattle, Boise, Butte and Anchorage, Alaska. After leaving here Swartz served at Kansas City, Mo., Eugene and Salem and served in the army postal service before going to Portland in 1946. Mr. Swartz is well known to the old timers here. He attended the local schools and graduated from the local high school, starting his postal career soon after graduation.
