# Area Residents Invited to Swim

Swimming lessons will start July 6 at the pool in Drain. According to Ted Wilson, manager of the summer recreation program in Drain, residents in this area are cordially invited to swim in the pool. The lessons are free, but there is a 20 cent charge for youngsters to get in the pool. Tuesday and Thursday 8 to 10, year old boys and girls will be given lessons, Monday and Wednesday, 4 to 7 year old boys and girls; and on Fridays those 10 years old and over.

Wilson pointed out that this has no connection with the Cottage Grove swim program, which comes in August in Springfield. He urged any interested parents to bring children down to swim and or to take the lessons. The pool is located in the North Douglas memorial park.

The Drain pool is open from 1 to 5 every day and from 7 to 9 evenings Monday through Friday. Saturday night there are private parties on request. Cost for adults is 50 cents; for children 20 cents. All girls must wear swim caps. If necessary, Wilson said that swimmers may rent all necessary equipment at the pool. Caps rent for 15 cents; swim suits for 35 cents; towels for 10 cents, or they can bring all equipment.
