Three home runs highlighted Cottage Grove's 12 to 3 victory over Glide in an Evergreen League contest at Kelly Field last Sunday. Buzz Wyant's clubbers capitalized on 12 hits, four walks and three errors to clobber the opponent and retain their first place tie with Myrtle Creek.

Green reached home on a double by Tracy, who crossed the plate on Coen's circuit clout, to make it a 3 to 1 ball game in the first. Glide's three counters came in the first, seventh and ninth innings, aided twice by Grove errors.

Grove tallied three more in the third off Tracy's homer, a Glide error and Tonole's double. Another three counters in the fourth made it a 9 to 1 ball game. CG went down 1-2-3 in the fifth, but came back with another trio in the sixth when Carpenter's home run brought in Tracy and Coen, winding up Cottage Grove's scoring for the day.

Tracy and Coen tied for top slugging honors with a home run, double and single apiece, followed closely by Carpenter with a homer and a single. Two singles by Cellars and White topped Glide's clouters.

Cowboys May Be Someday Honored In Hall of Fame

The cowboys you saw astride the wildly bucking broncs in the Riding Club Rodeo at Cottage Grove last week may someday be honored in a national Hall of Fame.

A movement is under way to establish a National Rodeo Hall of Fame foundation. C. A. Reynolds, Kansas City, who is sponsoring the project, thinks that it is high time that due respect be paid to the skills of the men who built the west as they are demonstrated by today's rodeo riders.

Reynolds, chairman of the board of the H. D. Lee Company, has been enlisting support of senators and governors of 17 western states. His company has pledged \$5,000 to the Foundation and a permanent hall of fame building. A bill providing for the incorporation of the non-profit foundation has been prepared and is expected to be sponsored in Congress by senators from the cattle states. It prescribes the methods of operation of the foundation and authorizes the establishment of permanent headquarters.

So far no site for the building has been selected, Reynolds said. He hopes the final decision to be made by the trustees appointed to the foundation after it is incorporated, will come soon and construction started in the near future.

Present plans call for two trustees each from North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Colorado, Wyoming, Montana, Idaho, Utah, Arizona, Nevada, California, Oregon and Washington. Other trustees from the east and midwest will fill out the board.

The bill provides that the governors of each of the western states be invited to serve as trustees. Most of them already have indicated they would be happy to serve.

After making a careful study of the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, N. Y., Reynolds thinks the Rodeo Hall of Fame should be organized along similar lines. He feels that it will honor more than a great American Sport, however.

Tribute will be paid not only to outstanding rodeo performers, but also to stock raisers and others who contribute to the sport including famous rodeo stock. Selection of those to be honored will be made by the Board of Trustees from among candidates proposed by the public, historians and rodeo fans.

Part of the Hall of Fame building will be a museum housing relics of the development of the west.

Midgets Topped In Three League Tilts

The CG state junior team (Midgets) dropped three games in the last two weeks, one 19 to 8 contest to Drain, a 14 to 5 game with Eugene's number one midget club and a close 16 to 13 contest to Eugene's second nine Wednesday evening.

Drain's big inning was the second when they garnered 10 counters. They were held to five, three and one runs in the next three innings. CG scored one counter in the second and third, then rallied with six in the fifth, but failed to catch up.

No information was available for the first Eugene encounter. In the second Eugene tilt, Grove grabbed two counters in the first and second and was blanked until the fifth, when they tallied one run.

Eugene, in the meantime, copied half of their runs in the first three innings, with four in the first and two in the second and third, making it an 8 to 5 contest up until the sixth. Grove then put on a surge of hitting which netted them four runs in the sixth and seventh, giving them 13 markers.

CG, however, was unable to hold Eugene to less than three in the sixth and five in the seventh as the northern midgets went on to win 16 to 13.

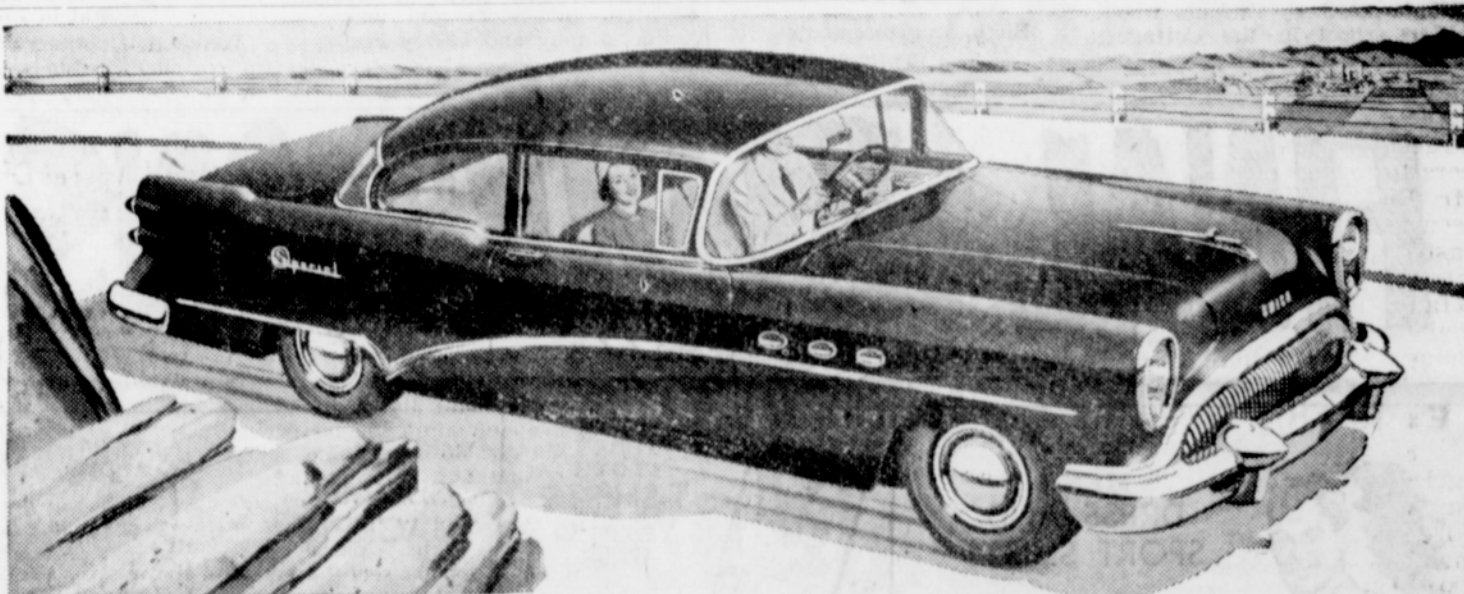
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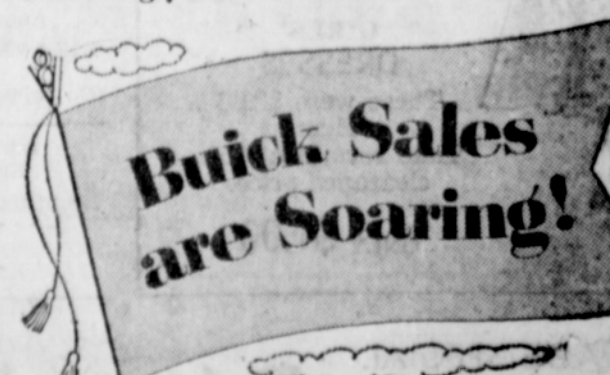
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
