Former Custodian Now Working As Supervisor

One stormy March morning in 1929 a man trudged into the Cottage Grove High School and began working. His tools consisted of brooms, mops, and various wrenches. Little did this man know that in twenty-five years he would be retiring from that job. This man was George Currin.

During his interview "George" gave a broad grin and said, "I am a dyed in the wool Oregonian and have been around here most of my life."

"Oh," he said, "The school has changed quite a bit since I started. When I began there were only 175 kids and now there are 650. Also, school used to be in the Jefferson building."

"George" went to school at Mt. View, Oregon. He has one brother and two children, a boy and a girl. Both live in Eugene.

"I don't remember any funny incidents," Mr. Currin replied with an impish grin. It seemed as he was struggling to keep from laughing but he offered no further comment.

"I have helped lots of kids out of tight spots," he offered. "When someone got in a jam he usually came to me and I was willing to help." "George" remembers lots of students from the past.

"One teacher stands out of the past," he replied, "Pop Grannis

used to teach Social Economics and the students would get him talking about something else. The period was shot once he got going. Pop was also principal."

On his seventy-second birthday Mr. Currin retired from full time service at Cottage Grove High School. During an assembly he was escorted to the stage by an honor guard consisting of the class presidents. Leroy Cotthrell presented him with a contour chair as a gift from the faculty and the students. George, who will be at school about two hours a day to supervise custodial activities, will always be part of old CG, for he is about as necessary as books, paper, and pencils.
