LONDON—Fire extinguishers of every kind, size, use and price were demonstrated with actual fire by Eugene representatives at the London school March 25. The London Literary Society members, sponsoring the project, and property owners of the London district, were told of the use and protection of individual units in and around the home. A CO₂ mixture, highly effective and as safe as the drink you get at your favorite soda fountain, was recommended for the home indoors since the spray will not harm home furnishings. Other mixtures were suitable for protection in mills, cars, motors and outdoor fires.

Actual fires were set near the river for demonstrations. About 30 families were represented. A "big" fire was set for demonstration of the larger type chemical extinguisher recommended for rural community use. However, no specific action was taken on the project.

Cookies and coffee were served during discussions of rural fire protection need and adequate protection quick enough. It is usually believed that there is not time enough to secure any type of protection not immediately at hand, when a rural home fire breaks out.
