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American Soldier Wants to See U. S. For First Time

FRANKFURT, Germany—Many men serve their country, but few do it sight unseen.

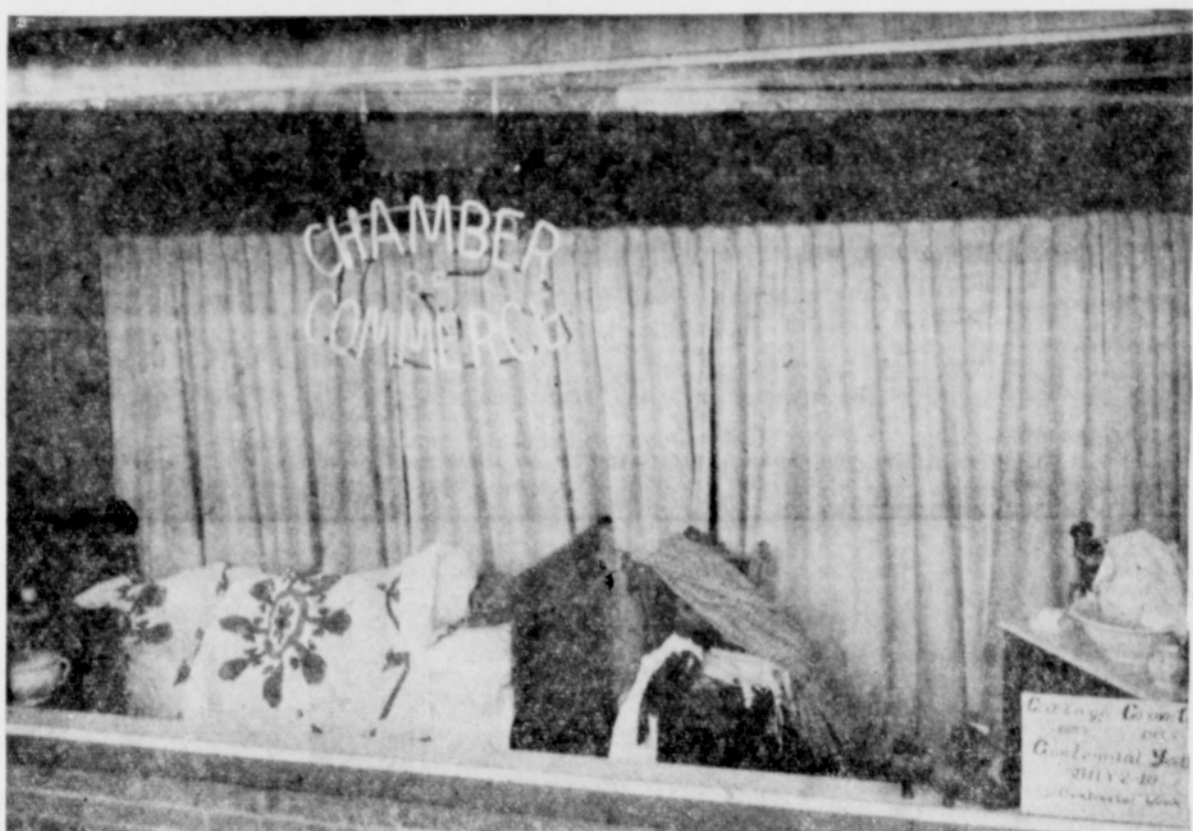
So it's no small wonder that Sergeant First Class Louis R. Blanco hopes to rotate to the United States when he completes his tour of duty with the Fourth Infantry Division in 1955.

For 11 years Blanco has served this country, but not once has he set foot in the United States.

The unusual story started 28 years ago when he was born in the city of San Juan, Puerto Rico. At the age of 11, his family moved to Panama where his father worked as a power engineer for the U. S. Army in the Canal Zone. He lived there until 1943 when he entered the U. S. Army.

As a soldier, Blanco was assigned to Puerto Rico. He remained there until 1944 when he was transferred to Panama. During the next two years, he saw duty in Costa Rica, Argentina and Colombia. In 1946 he returned to Panama, remaining there until 1952 when he was assigned to Europe.

Now, after 11 years of service with the United States Army, Blanco feels it's about time that he saw the country he has been serving.

Hearings on Hells Canyon Set in Apr.

Arrangements for the Hells Canyon field hearings in the Pacific Northwest by the United States Senate Committee will be completed during the week before the hearings with the visit of a staff member of the Interior and Insular Affairs Committee to each of the cities where hearings will be held, it was announced today.

The hearings, scheduled for the morning of April 4 in Boise, Idaho; the afternoon of April 4 in Lewiston, Idaho; April 5 in Pasco, Wash.; and April 6 in Portland, Ore., will be the first held on Senate Bill 1333, introduced March 9 by Senator Wayne Morse (D. Ore.) and co-sponsored by 29 other Senators. The bill would authorize Federal construction of Hells Canyon Dam on the Snake River between Oregon and Idaho. Members of the House Interior Committee have been invited to attend for the purpose of considering four similar bills which were introduced in the House of Representatives. Don Magnuson (D. Wash.), Edith Green (D. Ore.), Grace Frost (D. Idaho) and Lee Metcalf (D. Mont.).

Kite Flying Rules Stress Fun, Safety

Simple safety rules can increase the fun of kite flying and at the same time prevent danger to youngsters enjoying this ancient sport, according to F. L. Hilliker, local manager for Pacific Power & Light company.

He urged boys and girls to observe these four rules:

1. Always fly kites in an open field or playground, well away from power lines.
2. Use only dry cord for kite line.
3. Never use wet string or metal threads for kite line. These are conductors of electricity and can bring about a serious shock from accidental contact with overhead wires.
4. If a kite should lodge in a power line, or in a tree near power wires, leave it there. Don't try to take it down. Skilled power linemen never take chances with live wires—neither should you.

Parents also were urged to know the rules for safe kite flying and to help see that they are followed.

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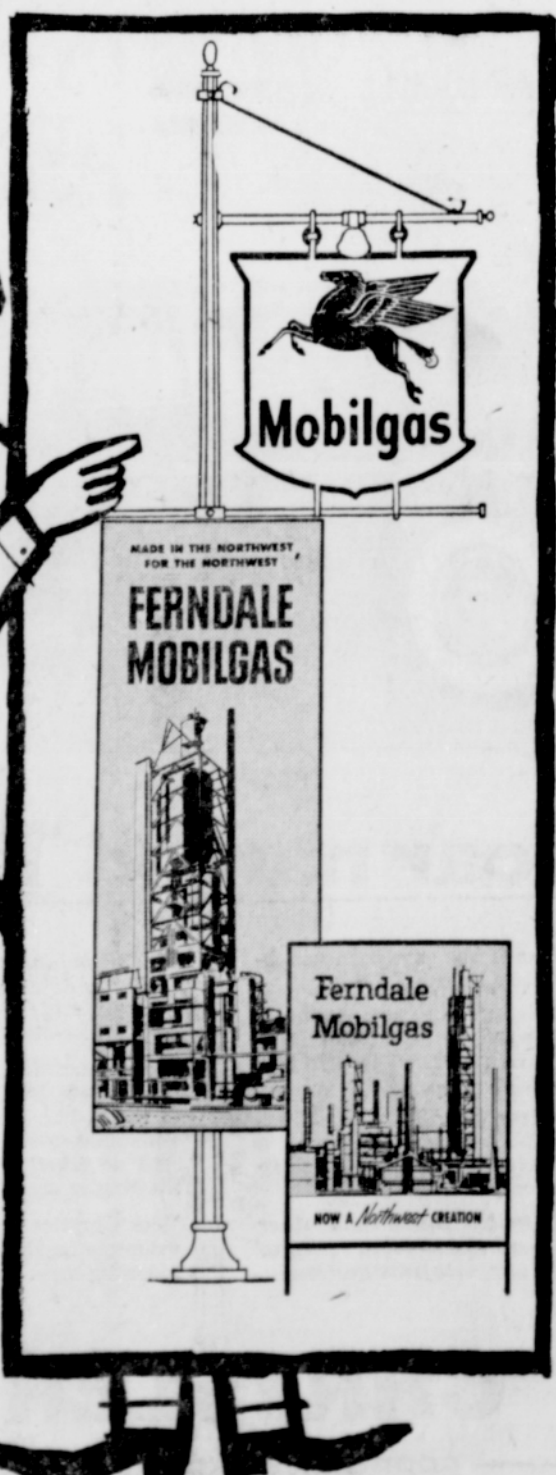
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
