Cottage Grove Harriers Spike Springfield in Dual Win Friday

Cottage Grove's high school track-and-field squad posted a 72-50 dual-meet victory at Springfield Friday afternoon, but Frank Sheffield set a new Springfield school record with an impressive 21.3 in the low hurdles—6/10 of a second under the mark the junior set last year. He also won the 100-yard dash. Another Springfield runner was a double winner, Sonhomore Karl Herringer winning the 880 and mile.

Jay Wilson won the high hurdles and pole vault and Tom Long the broad jump and 440 for Cottage Grove.

Cottage Grove had a triple winner in the JV's 68½-53½ decision over the Springfield JV's. Omyer winning the 100, 220 and broad jump. Dick Brown of Springfield winning the high jump and 440.

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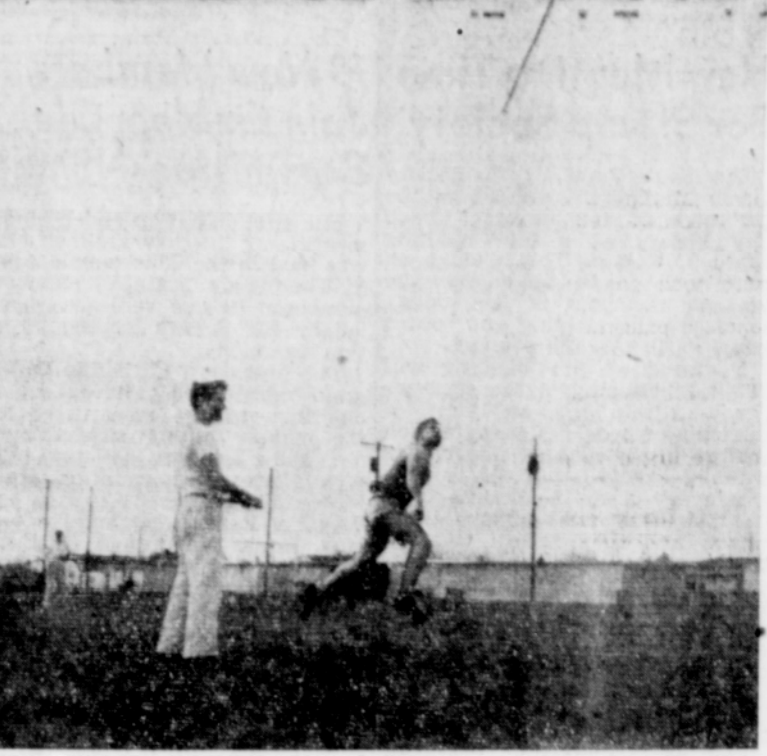
