Annual Gold Cup Stamp Show Set At Library 28th

Final arrangements have been completed for the South Lane Stamp Society's annual "gold cup" stamp show. The show is slated for 8 p.m. in the clubroom of the Cottage Grove city library Thursday, April 28.

Over a dozen frames of stamps have been entered in the show by members of the Society. To qualify for the show, a member of the Society must have begun the collection to be exhibited within the calendar year preceding the current year's show. Judging is conducted on a point basis, and points are given for originality of preparation of the frame of stamps, neatness, research, and completeness of the material exhibited.

Judging for the April 28 show is to be done by Leo R. T. Burton of the Greater Eugene Stamp Society, who is also to be the chief judge of the forthcoming May 28-30 Northwest Federation of Stamp clubs 15th annual exhibition to be held in Eugene.

The winning exhibit is to be awarded the South Lane Stamp Society's gold cup. This annual award was won at the 1954 stamp show by Bill Randall of Cottage Grove.

President of the Society, Joyce Bonini, has invited all interested persons to attend the stamp show, which will be open to the public. Short discussions on stamps are to be given by members of the Greater Eugene Stamp Society following the judging of the exhibition, and refreshments are to be served.

Merry Mixers 4-H Club Have Taffy Pull 22nd

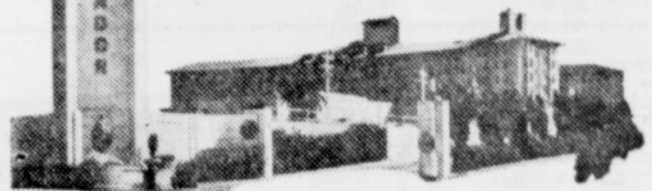
