Jaycee Air Fair Sched at Portland Air Base Sunday

Portland's first Annual Jaycee Air Fair will be staged at the Portland Air Base on Portland's International Air Port Sunday, July 24. The show, sponsored by the Portland Junior Chamber of Commerce in cooperation with the Air Force, is offered as a public service and is open to the general public without admission charge.

Displays will be open 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. and scenic air rides over Portland will be available at cost through West Coast Airlines from the show area. Arrival by National Guard Helicopter at 1:30 p.m. of Miss Air Fair, lovely Karlyn Eycliffson, will signal start of the air show.
 Many unusual types of aircraft displays and air performances will be presented for the first time for the benefit of Oregon residents. Glider flight demonstrations, an unfamiliar sight in Oregon skies, will be presented by members of the Seattle Glider Council. The latest in military, commercial airline, executive and private planes will be shown in the air and on the ground. Included will be a rocket assisted take-off, simulated air rescue by Coast Guard helicopter, a mock "scramble" of two F-89 Scorpion fighters, and many other demonstrations.
 Warren Hunter, Jr., chairman of the Portland Junior Chamber Aviation Committee, said free parking will be provided on the Air Base near the demonstrations. Unique use of two way radio between helicopters and Multnomah County Sheriff's cars should keep traffic speeded up to and from the show area.
 Many local businessmen - pilots and their respective majors from over Oregon and Washington have been invited to attend. There is no charge for the show, according to the Portland Jaycees.

State Fair Adds Color Photography To Photo Class

SALEM, July 19 — Amateur photographers will be able to compete in color classifications as well as black and white during the eight-day session of the 1955 Oregon State Fair, according to Mrs. C. H. Rundell, Portland, superintendent of the art department.

Any type of photographic study will be acceptable, she said, from portraits to mechanical studies. Though technical quality will be important, slides will be rated primarily on the interest of the subject and its composition. As in the black and white division, there will be no entry fee.

Color photography as a competitive classification was added this year due to the wide spread interest of photographers in this field.

Prize monies will remain the same in art, photography, etc., but in sculpture the awards have

been increased to an equal of those for professional art. Art teachers will be on hand during the fair to assist viewers in understanding the finer points of technique demonstrated in each class of work.
 Fair dates this year are September 3 through 10 at Salem.

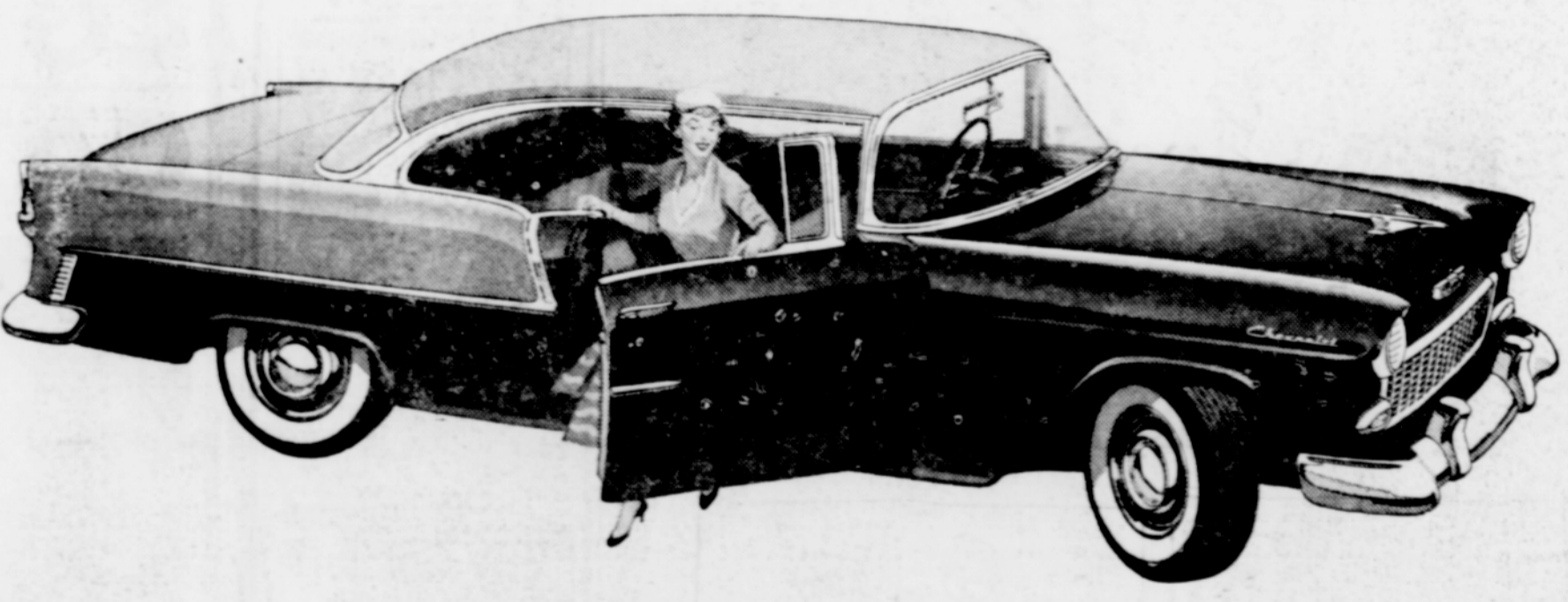
