Education Agenda Is Extended for Unwed Mothers

As a new feature of their long-established confidential maternity service, a program of high school classes for unmarried mothers will be offered this fall by The Boys and Girls Aid Society of Oregon, according to Stuart R. Stimmel, State Director. Classes will be held at the Society's headquarters, 2301 N. W. Glisan Street, in Portland, under the auspices of

the State Department of Education, and staffed with two part-time teachers.

All high school subjects required for graduation will be offered, and enough electives, including commercial subjects, to allow each girl to continue her course without interruption.

"Medical care for both mother and child we already provide," says Mr. Stimmel, "as well as counseling by skilled and understanding staff members. Our services are available to mothers whether they plan to keep their

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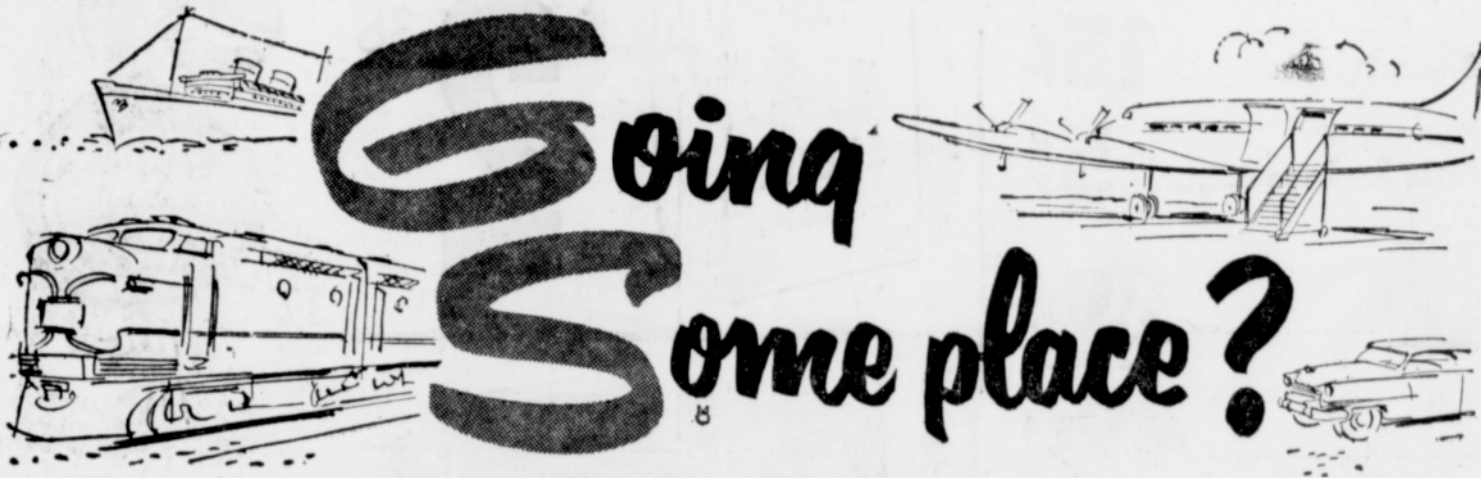
