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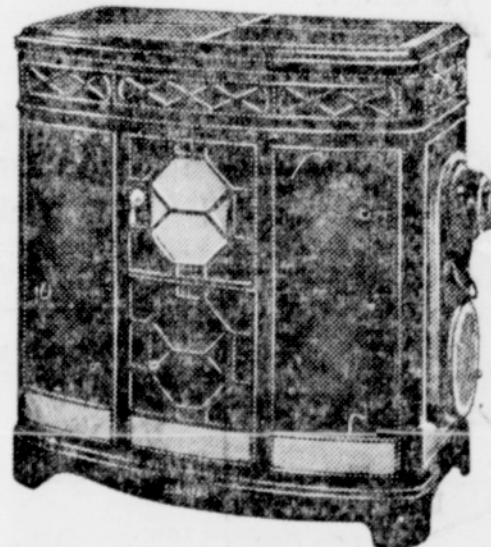
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DORENA—Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Ponton left Friday for a week's stay at their ranch at Ashwood.
