New Chief State Geologist Is Son Of Local Resident



Lloyd C. Wolfe, who has just been promoted to the position of chief geologist with the Oregon state highway commission, is the son of Mrs. Amelia B. Wolfe of 743 North 9th St., Cottage Grove. He will replace Lewis Scott, who has taken a position with the U. S. bureau of public roads in Costa Rica. Announcement of the promotion was made by R. H. Baldock, state highway engineer.

In his new position, Wolfe will be responsible for the state's geological exploration, landslide control and embankment settlement correction. He is a graduate of Oregon State college and has served as supervisory geologist for the U. S. bureau of reclamation in California. For a time he was geologist at Diablo in Panama, with the U. S. army engineers and later was located at Elko, Nev. He came to the Oregon state highway department in August, 1953. He is married and the father of three sons, 7, 6, and 2 years old.

Mrs. Wolfe, mother of the new chief geologist, came to Cottage Grove three years ago. Once known as the "Oregon Composer," she has written several songs, including "In the Shadows of the Stars," "In the Field of Broken Hearts," "He's an All American Man," and "Take Me to Your Arms Again."

(Continued from Page One) cleared of all school activities and is now known throughout the community as church night. Most of the churches as a result of this arrangement have planned activities which have appeal for young people on the available nights. The churches have also been able to carry out a successful program of inter-church recreation, particularly basketball, in cooperation with the school.

Not only have the churches benefited from this cooperation, but the schools also have found that the ministers are available and eager to help in many activities and problems. Every year a number of ministers have appeared in the classrooms, before school organizations as guest speakers, members of panels, etc. Ministers have frequently been consulted in counseling problems and have worked with members of the faculty on special committees.

She tells of asking people what schools were for, and getting the answer that "schools are for learning to read and write and do arithmetic." But even a vagabond knew that this was a shallow answer, and one day she discovered what schools are really for: "to help people become better than they are." Schools and churches share this purpose together. In Cottage Grove, in earnest monthly meetings, leaders of both groups have worked together for more than four years to realize this common goal, and a unique experiment has become a permanent working arrangement in community cooperation.
