CG Bowlers Take 2 Firsts at VFW Jr., Adult Tourney

Cottage Grove bowlers returned victoriously from Eugene Saturday, with trophies from two out of the three first places in the VFW Junior-Adult bowling tournament. In the junior and bowling parent classification, first and second both went to Grove bowlers.

Larry Davis and Clint Brice rolled the high series of the tournament with a walk-away 1352. Davis, who had never broken 200 before, rolled 218-204-177 for an outstanding 599 scratch series. Brice, the adult bowler of the pair, rolled a snappy 210-161-208 for a 579 scratch series. With handicaps, Davis' series totaled 713, over 100 points ahead of second high, another Grove bowler, Jack Anderson with 611.

In the junior and bowling parent category, Bill and William Bryson took high honors with a 1193 series. Young Bill rolled 128-163-174 for a 465 scratch series and 582 with handicap. Bill Sr. hit 157-155-182 for 494 scratch and 611 with handicap.

Second in the junior bowling parent category were Kathy

O'Malley and Grace Jones, one point behind the champion Brysons, with a 1192 series. Kathy rolled 129-119-114 for a 362 scratch and 575 with handicap, while Grace scored 167-160-155 for a 482 scratch and 617 with handicap.

Cottage Grove junior bowlers placed with high scratch game of five out of six flights, winning several lines of five bowling at Cottage Bowl. The local youngsters would have won more, except for the ruling that both categories could not be taken by one bowler. Lions Smother Bulldogs; Ron Rice Scores 31 Points

The Cottage Grove Lions proved their superiority over the North Bend Bulldogs in a special playoff for third place in District 8-A-1, held at Roseburg Tuesday night, by smothering them 82-54.

Ron Rice paced the attack with 31 points. The playoff followed a double loss weekend for the Lions, when they fell to both Marshfield and North Bend on the coast. Grove will now face North Salem at the Willamette University gym in Salem, Thursday (to-day) for a state tournament berth.

The Bulldogs started strong, with Bob Jacobson and Bert Why sinking a pair from the right to give North Bend a 4-0 lead. The Lions stalked back on a fielder and three free throws by Dean Castle, a pair of field goals by Ron Rice, and a one-hander by Leon Hayes to lead 11-6 midway through the quarter. North Bend's star forward Jack Shanley put

the Bulldogs back in the game for the last time, with a pair of field goals, followed by a free throw from Ken Carver, to deadlock the game at 11-11.

Ron Rice started on a scoring spree after the deadlock that confused and bewildered the Bulldogs. He scored nine points to push the Lions up to a 24-13 first quarter lead. Rice made as many points as the entire North Bend team in that quarter.

Jim Nichols opened the second period with a hook from the right, followed by three foul shots from the Bulldogs. Then Rice went on another six point scoring party. At the end of first half North Bend led Ron Rice 24-21, but Cottage Grove held a 35-24 lead over the Bulldogs.

Jack Shanley scored a basket for the Bulldogs at the opening of the second half, then Rice and Castle had a real haul. With the quarter half over, Rice had scored 8 more points, Castle had made 7, and Nichols scored two, giving the Lions a 52-26 lead. At the end of the period Cottage Grove led 61-37.

Larry Burleson pushed it on up to 65-37 with a pair of fielders at the opening of the final period. The Bulldogs scored, Castle scored, and Rice made his 30th and 31st points on free throws.

Even the second quarter outscored the Bulldogs in the closing minute of play, with George Woodworth sinking a long hook shot and Ted Picknell scoring a pair of free throws.

Ron Rice had his best game of the season with 31 points, followed by Dean Castle with 22. Bert Why scored 17 for North Bend.
