College Students Form Model UN

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—The hopes and conflicts of the United Nations will be brought to Oregon State college April 4 to 7 when nearly 1000 college students from 71 colleges in the west stage a "model" U.N., patterned exactly like the international body.

Each college participating will represent a U.N. country and representatives will be organized into the various U.N. bodies—security council, economic and social council, trusteeship council, and general assembly.

Assignments were made in January to give schools an opportunity to prepare their issues and to study their nation's background and politics.

Aimed at "creating better understanding of world affairs and international policy," the sessions will be open to observers and hundreds of students and interested persons from throughout the Northwest are expected to visit meetings.

San Francisco State college will

represent the United States and San Jose State will be Russia. Other members of the "Big Five" will be Lewis and Clark college, England; University of Oregon, China; and University of Southern California, France.

Assignments of other Oregon colleges include: Portland State, Soviet Ukraine; Oregon College of Education, Liberia; Eastern Oregon College of Education, Bulgaria; Southern Oregon College of Education, Luxembourg; Reed college, Egypt; and Willamette university, Canada.

Issues to be debated will be those currently before the regular United Nations. These will include such topics as peaceful use of atomic energy, regulation of armed forces and armaments, and the Arab-Israeli issue.

As host school, OSC will not represent a country but will direct conference procedures and arrangements.

George Papadopoulos of Alexandria, Egypt, a student in agriculture at OSC, is conference director. He was sent to regular U.N. sessions in New York during December to observe procedures and to confer with members of the secretariat on conference arrangements.
