

## Lions Place 2nd at Roseburg's Annual Invitational Track Meet

Cottage Grove placed second behind Grants Pass in the sixth annual Roseburg invitational track meet at Finlay field Saturday. Cottage Grove tallied 157 1/2 points compared to 222 by the Cavemen. Behind the Lions, Roseburg scored 133, North Bend 129 1/2, Marshfield 129 and Douglas of Winston 63. Dean Castle, Henry Martin and Don Martin combined talents to collapse the meet discus relay record by flinging it 373' 4". The mark was previously held by Roseburg at 338 feet.

Most of the Grove points came from second placings. The only other first was Dan Simonson's 58.9 in the first heat of the 440 yard dash. Castle paced the local crew with 13 1/4 points on a first and third.
