The agency budgets that will be considered are: Boy Scouts of America, Girl Scouts, Salvation Army, Catholic Charities, Y.M.C.A., Y.W.C.A., U of O-Y.W.C.A., U of O-Y.W.C.A., Assn. for the Help of Retarded Children, Cottage Grove Community Chest,

MRS. JESS HILL ELECTED

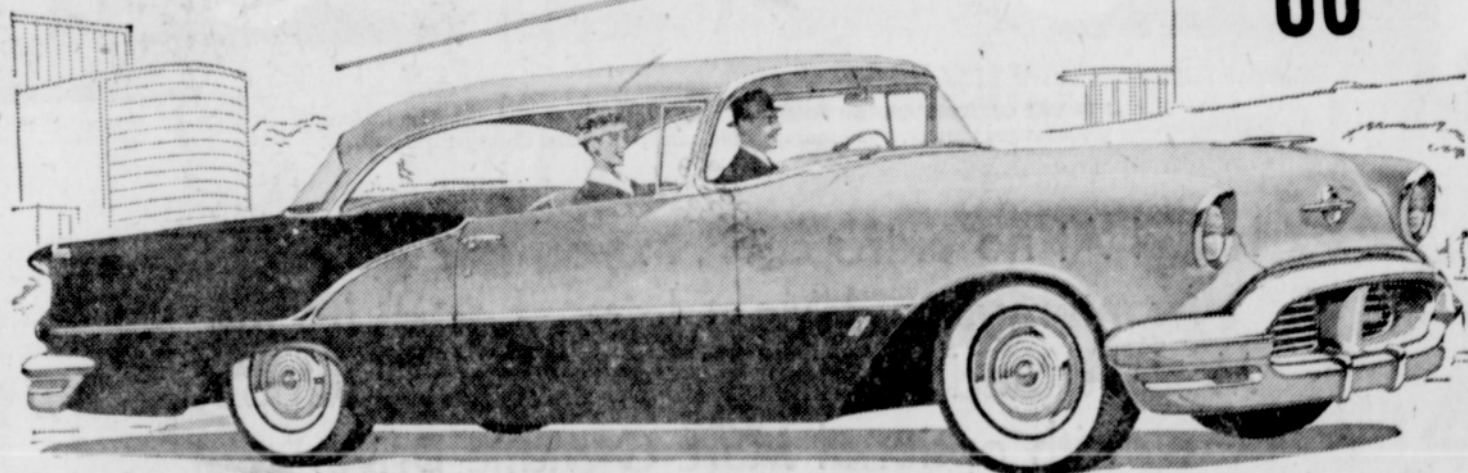
