### Fish Being Tagged At Bonneville Dam

Is there a delay in migration time for salmon and steelhead as the result of the dams in the Columbia river? If so, how much? What effect will The Dalles dam have on migrating fish?

Fish are now being tagged above the fish ladder at Bonneville dam by biologists of the Oregon fish commission in an attempt to answer at least in part this very question.

This study is being conducted by the state fish commission under contract with the U. S. corps of army engineers. The work consists of tagging the fish at Bonneville dam and recovering them at McNary dam.

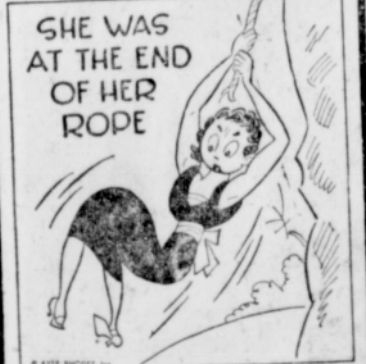

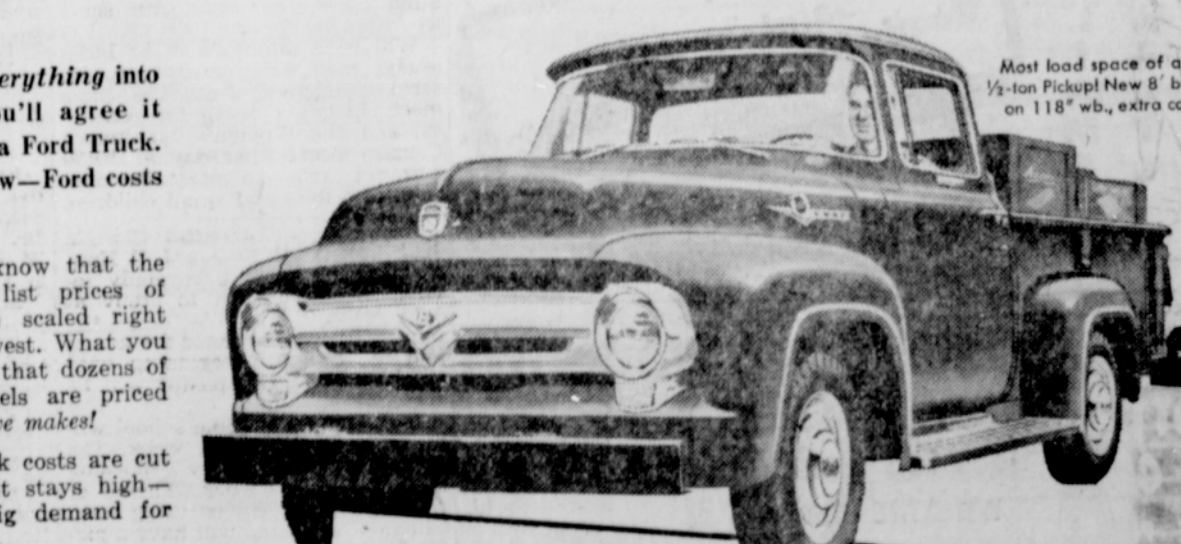
