Band Concert Given at Park Thurs., Aug. 9

Probably one of the least known activities of the South Lane Summer Recreation program is the annual summer band concert.

The concert was held at the city park here in Cottage Grove Thursday evening, August 9. About 130 Grovers attended.

Approximately 50 persons of all ages from all over Lane County participated in the concert. The director was Charles Steele, also director of the high school band.

The group met twice weekly during the six weeks before the concert for rehearsals. Many of those in the band had not played for years. And even though the music, generally good, was rough in places it was obvious that the band was having a good time.

On the program was music of all sorts: Semi-popular, classical and march music. Director "Bucky" Steele quipped various remarks to his band and to the audience during the concert, keeping the evening on an informal and enjoyable level.

A solo "You'll Never Walk Alone" was sung by Bonnie Weinkauf. She also plays the tenor saxophone in the band. A trombone solo was given by Ida Coston. She played "Some Enchanted Evening." Lyle Chaffee played a cornet solo, "Londonderry Air."

The concert was the only one of the season in Cottage Grove.

New Books, Circulation Data Reported From City Library

The monthly report from the Cottage Grove library for July shows a slight decline in total circulation for the month of July 1956 over July 1955, but at the same time shows a considerable increase in total borrowers since this time last year.

The total circulation for July was 1473. Last year the July total was 1535. The total for June of this year was 1730.

The total number of library card holders now is 3414. After July of 1955, the total was 3108.

Seventeen new books were purchased during July and five were discarded. Thirty-one cards were issued and 17 canceled. Total children's books circulation was 660, total adult, 813.

Among the new books is "Don't Go Near the Water," a popular best seller by William Brinkley, author of "Quicksand." Another new addition is "The Mysterious North," a book about the Canadian arctic by Pierre Berton, author of "The Royal Family."

Three new mysteries are "Dram of Poison" by Armstrong, "Unappointed Rounds" by Disney, and "Far Traveler" by Coles. Some new adult fictions are "Wind in His Fist," by Jennings, "Speak to the Winds," by Moore, and "Charmed Circle," by Ertz.

Two new biographies are "Dear Mad'n," a story of the life of a 80-year-old woman in the wilds of the Siskiyou Mountain in California, written by Stella W. Patterson; and "Sand in My Eyes," by Signiora Russell Laune. New non-fictions include "The Mind Goes Forth" by Harry and Bonaro Overstreet, and "The Human Body," by Edith E. Sproul, M.D.

Some new books for teen-agers are "Fire and the Gold," by Phyllis Whitney; "Maggie," by Breck; "Carry on Mr. Bowditch," by La-tham; and "Atomic Experiments for Boys," by Yates.
