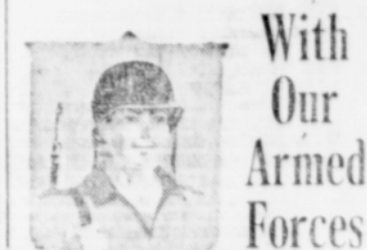

PFC. T. Lechner Qualifies as Pilot

Pfc. Terry E. Lechner participated in the 1st Division Marine maneuvers at Camp Pendleton, Calif., October 9, when he piloted a VMO-6 single-blade helicopter in what they termed HELILEX training.

The training consisted of flights from San Diego out over the Pacific ocean and landing on the aircraft carrier USS Badoeng Strait during the pilots carrier qualification flight. The entire flying staff of VMO-6 qualified in the new twin-rotor RHOK-1's. Pilots have to make six successful land-

ings on USS Badoeng Strait to qualify as carrier pilots in twin-rotor RHOK-1's.

Pfc. Lechner also participated in the helicopter "raid" on Camp Pendleton from Carrier "Badoeng Strait" on October 12.

The next maneuver training, the MAR-LEX, is expected to be in the Philippines with five divisions of Marines participating.

Lechner is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Lechner. He enlisted in the Marines last January.
