Religious Programs Slated for Month

December is a month of activity for the Church of Christ, Sixth and Gibbs, with a variety of religious programs planned, beginning with a Christmas film Sunday night, December 16, and climaxed with the cantata, "Chimes of the Holy Night," the night of December 23.

The film, "Our Bible—How It Came to Us," is of tremendous value to those interested in the story back of the present day Bible and begins at 7:30 p.m. The 84-minute film of dramatic, documentary action and facts which cover 20 centuries beginning with the use of the Scriptures in Jesus' day, shows how the New Testament was written, translated into Latin as well as the languages of Europe and finally into English.

It depicts Philip explaining the book of Isaiah; Paul dictating the epistle to the Thessalonians; Jerome as he labors to translate the Bible into Latin; Luther as he refuses to recant; Tyndale arranging for the first printing of an English New Testament, and Coverdale examining the first printed English Bible.

This film, produced by the American Bible Society, has been highly recommended by religious authorities throughout the country. The public is invited to its showing.

In addition the choir, Girls' Chorus, and a group of Junior girls will present the final number of the program, which is a Fred Waring arrangement of "Gloria In Excelsis Deo."
