Evangelistic Series To Start Sunday Gibbs Ave. Church

Howard Hutchins, minister of Oregon City Church of Christ, will be at the Gibbs Avenue Church of Christ Sunday morning to lead in a series of evangelistic meetings which will continue through two weeks. The services will begin each evening at 7:30. There will be no services on Saturdays.

Mr. Hutchins is a native of Minnesota. Born in Minneapolis, he spent most of his early life there and entered military service for World War I. When the war ended he came West and enrolled in Eugene Bible college (now known as Northwest Christian college) in Eugene.

Active ministry was begun while a student at NCC. He started his first full time pastorate at Oregon City in 1929. In the early 1940's he went to Butler University in Indianapolis for further education. Upon completing his work there he returned to Oregon and led the work of the Klamath Falls Christian church. After four years there the church at Oregon City recalled him and he has been laboring here since present time. Altogether he has served more than 20 years at Oregon City. This is the longest period of time any minister of the Churches of Christ has served on one field in Oregon. While studying at Eugene Mr. Hutchins established the Churches of Christ at Lorane and at Noti. At Oregon City he led in the remodeling of the building which was there when he arrived and since that time has directed the erection of a completely new sanctuary.

Evangelistic campaigns, such as he will direct at Cottage Grove, have been held in every part of Oregon by Mr. Hutchins. His sermon subjects for Sunday are "The Cost of Belonging" at the morning service, and in the evening "The King of Kings and Lord of Lords."
