## Slides of Iona Community to Be Shown by Pastor

The Rev. D. Hugh Peniston will show slides he took at Iona last summer, after the monthly church dinner on Wednesday, February 27.

Iona is a small island off the coast of Scotland, and the community there was founded by St. Columba in the 6th century. It was one of the centers of learning at that time and its monks traveled far over Scotland and England. Today the community has been revived, and attracts Protestant ministers from all over Europe and even from the United States.

Those who stay there help in the actual work of restoring the old buildings and lead a very simple life. Those who actually become members of the Iona community, no matter where they live, dedicate all their earnings, over and above what is necessary to maintain existence, to the work of God. Dr. George McLeod, the present leader of the community and the new Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, has revived great interest in the work of intercession, and lectures on it to those who visit the island, as well as holding services of intercession for persons whose names are sent to him from all over the world.

Mr. Peniston was there for a week, and helped to hoe the graves of some of the 49 kings of Scotland who are buried there. The week after that Iona was visited by Queen Elizabeth. Iona is a beautiful island, according to Mr. Peniston, who says life is very simple there.

Anyone not connected with the church is welcome to attend. The dinner will be the usual covered dish meal at 6:30 p.m. with families bringing a main dish and a salad or dessert. A baby sitter will be provided for the pre-school children.

The program on Iona will begin at approximately 7:30 p.m. in Fellowship hall.

## Baptist Missionary To South India Is Sunday Speaker

Mrs. F. P. Manley, missionary of the American Baptist Foreign Mission in Secunderabad, South India, will speak at Cottage Grove First Baptist church Sunday at 11 a.m.

Rev. and Mrs. F. P. Manley are the only American Baptist Foreign Mission Society personnel in the city of Secunderabad in Hyderabad State. It is an important educational center for the India government and the Manleys find a challenging field of opportunity among the students of these colleges. The government also maintains a TB hospital here and has four Baptist churches, three of which are self-supporting, and four other places of worship. Almost 700 church members belong to these various groups.

Secunderabad is only one of two mission stations where the Manleys take responsibility for the evangelistic work, the other one being Hanumakonda. Both Mr. and Mrs. Manley have unusual gifts that lend themselves to fellowship groups. In writing of their work, March, 1952, Mrs. Manley says: "We feel our task is to establish fellowship groups that will be so rooted in vital experience of God and so united in fellowship that, come what may, they will be able to withstand and survive any social or political upheavals."

Mrs. Manley first went to South India in 1935. She was born in Cambridge, Mass., and is a member of the Redlands Baptist church, Redlands, Calif. She holds the degree of B.R.E. from Boston University, and an M.A. degree from Columbia University, New York City. The Manleys have a son, Francis Penley Jr., born in India in 1940.

## Nampa Pastor to Be Guest Speaker During Lutheran Evangelism Week

In 1931 he transferred to Medford where he served until 1950 when he accepted a call to the Nampa church.

Pastor Young has three children, two married daughters in Roseburg and Medford and one son who is in his third year of study for the ministry at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Mo.

During his ministry, Rev. Mr. Young has held several important offices within the church at large, having served as secretary of the Oregon Pastoral Conference for nine years as well as serving on several district committees. For the last six years he has served as visitor of Circuit Seven.

Pastor Young has announced that the general theme of his series of discussions will be "What Christianity Has to Offer." Sunday morning, 11 a.m. service topic will be "Pray for Missions." Monday evening at 8 p.m. his topic will be "Christianity Offers the Only True God." Tuesday evening, "Christianity Offers the Only True Picture of Man."
