Many Appliances In Cordless Class

"Cordless" appliances may revolutionize the small appliance industry.

Already in the cordless class, says Miss Virginia Houtchens, Lane extension agent, are electric clocks, shavers, hand mixers, small power tools, edgers, grills and toothbrushes. One large retailer predicts that within 10 years more than half of all household appliances on the market will be battery powered.

"There's appeal in the idea of not being completely dependent on an electrical outlet," the agent said.

Cordless appliances came into being with the development of a new lightweight battery. It is a sealed nickel cadmium battery which is rechargeable by plugging it into a regular electric outlet.
