Lane County groups can brighten their January programs with the real-life adventure story of a 21-year old Oregon State University co-ed who spent six months as an IFYE in Luxembourg.

Reata Macy Young, who returned in late November from her international goodwill tour sponsored by the Oregon Bankers Association will visit in Lane County Jan. 21-23 and will accept invitations to speak and show colored slides. Requests for her appearance should be made to Mrs. Joy Snodgrass, Lane extension agent in 4-H Club work, at DI 2-1311, Ext. 201.

As an International Farm Youth Exchange delegate, Reata lived with six Luxembourg families — three weeks each. She shared the family work and social life; became conversant in Belgian, French, German and Spanish; baked lemon meringue pie and cinnamon rolls by popular request; learned to ride English style ("bareback with stirrups," she calls it) and to jump a horse.

Reata was chosen as an IFYE on the basis of her maturity, interest in people, familiarity with farm life, and a willingness to share her experience with other Oregonians.

Any young person between the

ages of 20 and 30, single, with a background of rural life, and experience in 4-H Club work or similar youth group is eligible to become a candidate as an IFYE.
