Potluck Dinner to Kickoff Missions Study at Church

Lecture Series Slated in Eugene

Mrs. Marguerite Schuhart of Sacramento, Calif., will give a series of Bible lectures in Eugene at the Y.W.C.A., 2055 Patterson, beginning January 18.

Mrs. Schuhart's formal study of the Bible began with her undergraduate work with Dr. Carl Sumner Knopf at the University of Southern California, of which she is a graduate. Her Bible study was continued under Dr. Mabel Domineck with a historical approach. Her major work, however, has been from a literary standpoint under Mrs. Edyth Armstrong Hoyt, with whom she is now associated, and together they conduct and lecture in tours each spring to the Bible Lands. Mrs. Schuhart has also done considerable graduate work at Sacramento State College on studies in the Middle East.

Two courses will be given. The morning series will be, "Paul, the Universal Apostle." The evening subject is, "Highlights of the Old Testament Continuity."
