

DAVID W. GRIFFITH RECEIVED BY KING GEORGE IN LONDON

Producer of "The Great Love" Is Honored by British Monarch at Buckingham Palace.

When David W. Griffith, the famous producer of "The Birth of a Nation," "Intolerance," and "Hearts of the World," was in England "shooting" scenes of the latter picture, he was prevented by reason of his duties as producer from obeying the "command" of King George to attend him at Buckingham palace. Later, however, Mr. Griffith appeared before the king and Queen Mary and was graciously received. The King complimented Mr. Griffith upon his production of "Intolerance," which the monarch had seen, and assured him of his ready cooperation in any picture production dealing with the war and British war-time activities which he might project.

It thus happens that in "The Great Love," Mr. Griffith's remarkable aircraft photoplay which will be shown at the Eugene theater August 22, 23, and 24, many of the most illustrious women of the British aristocracy are pictured. In this respect, independent of every other consideration, this picture is one of the most remarkable ever presented to the public.

RED CROSS NOTES.

The shipment last week consisted of 50 helpless case shirts and 360 five-yard rolls, representing a cost in material of \$170. Members of both the branch and auxiliaries are doing very satisfactory work on the shirts.

The surgical dressing department reminds one of a bee hive, so busy are the women picking over moss and making pads. The British are making four million sphagnum moss pads a month and the Canadians twenty million annually. This branch hopes to complete a thousand by September 1.

Many more workers are needed at once for the surgical dressing rooms. An order has been received for 1000 sphagnum moss pads, which must be delivered by September 14.
