NO SPANISH INFLUENZA HERE AS FAR AS KNOWN

So far as is known Spanish influenza, which is raising such havoc in other parts of the country, has not made its appearance in Lane County. A report was circulated that a few cases had ap-

peared in Eugene, but City Health Officer Cheshire reports that such is not the case and none of the other physicians of that city know of any cases.

Dr. Cheshire said that as far as he has studied this apparently new disease it is much like the original influenza or grip that was brought to this country from Russia 25 years ago and which spread from one end of the United States to the other. Since then the disease has been characterized as grip or ingrippe and has been here ever since.

Grip is usually a severe sickness, but many people call a mere bad cold by that name whether they are very sick from it or not. The symptoms of Spanish grip, says Dr. Cheshire, are very much like those of the old-fashioned grip. The victim is attacked suddenly with a chill and usually becomes quite ill, while in the case of a mere cold is grip, one simply feels miserable and gets over it much quicker than he does the real disease.
