has made the world still more safe for democrats.

Senator Bell's bill to concentrate the school funds of the state in the county treasuries does not seem to be the dangerous and vicious piece of legislation that some at first feared. Senator Bell estimates that conservatively the dis-

tricts will by this method earn \$2000 a year on funds on hand, as the county funds draw interest and that possibly a like amount will be saved in premiums on bonds which school clerks must now furnish.

Editors Jenkins and Shelton, of Eugene, blew in today on the same train, seeming to have some community-of-interest proposition on down here, but to avoid arousing suspicion they did not eat together and returned on different trains. They seemed to be well pleased with the way the machinery is moving and to be satisfied with the conduct of

the Lane county solons, which was something of a relief to those worthy gentlemen.

Lane county solons all agree that the school teachers of their home county, or the votes of the teachers of their home county are very dear—the distinction was not made very clear—but, anyway, they voted for the measure to give the dear girls a minimum wage of \$75 a month and agreed that all were worth more than that, either for school teachers or housekeepers.

When you attempt to step on the rural

high school, you might as well jump up on Representative Wheeler's most sensitive corn—and he is right after a bill of that character which has come over from the senate and which would take the sustenance from the rural high school and is apparently in the interest of the city high school. It seems that Senator Bell was the only one to vote against the measure in the senate and that Senator Jones had for the moment forgotten the rural vote to which he owes his election.

Senator Bell has introduced at the instance of E. J. Adams a bill which

would permit rural districts to organize as municipalities and vote bonds for the construction of roads within the districts. It is thought that this kind of legislation would clear up the road problem in such sections as Lorane and Lost Creek in Lane county.

After you, my dear Gaston! After you, my dear Alphonse! This little role was enacted here today by Representative Bean and Senator Jones. Both had introduced identical bills. Beans' bill had passed the house and it occurred to Senator Jones that one of the bills should be withdrawn. When anything

occurs to Jones that is equivalent to action and he sent such word forthwith to Representative Bean. Bean agreed with Jones and sent back word that he would suggest to Jones that he act upon his own suggestion so wisely made. Jones was as slow to take the hint, evidently, as Bean had been, so he moved that his bill which had not passed the senate, be substituted for the Bean bill. However, Senator Bell took it into his head that the manner of proceeding was wrong and that there was no use wasting further time on a bill that had not passed either house and the Jones bill was taken off the calendar.
