TESTED RECIPES.

Italian Macaroni—Cook the macaroni until tender in stock instead of plain salted water. The stock may be made by adding half a teaspoonful of extract of beef to the water. Heat one pint of tomatoes, add a little onion, bay leaf, salt, pepper and a teaspoonful of butter. Add the cooked macaroni and serve with or without grated cheese.

Whipped Cream Pie—Make a crust line a deep dish with it, prick thoroughly and bake, being careful not to get it too brown. When done spread with a layer of jelly or jam; whip a cup of sweet cream, sweeten and flavor with vanilla, spread it over the jelly or jam, and set on ice, or where it will keep cool.

Chop Suey—Three slices of salt pork or bacon, one cup of celery, two cups

onions, two cups tomatoes (stewed), one pound hamburger. Fry salt pork or bacon, onions, celery and tomato for half an hour or until done. Then add hamburger (which is cooked before adding to the other).
