OREGON TO THE FRONT AS A SEED PRODUCER

(Department of Agriculture Seed Reporter.)

Oregon in 1918 was one of nine states to ship more than 800,000 pounds of red clover seed.

Only five other states shipped more alsike clover than Oregon.

Only ten other states were in Oregon's class as a producer of white clover seed.

All Willamette valley counties are listed as among the nation's heaviest producers of red clover seed.

Oregon is the second state in the union in acreage devoted to production of onion sets, with average yield of five tons to the acre for 150 acres.

Oregon is fourth state in production of onion seeds with average yield of 330 pounds to the acre for 60 acres.

Oregon is second only to California in average yield per acre of snap bean seed.

Oregon leads the entire union in average yield per acre of garden pea seed.

Oregon ranks first in average yield per acre of pumpkin seed and squash seed.

Oregon is highest by 45 per cent in average yield per acre of spinach seed.

Multnomah is one of the leading counties of the entire nation in production of garden pea seed, sweet corn seed, cabbage seed, carrot seed, onion seed, turnip seed and parsnip seed.

Marion is one of the leading counties in the nation in the production of garden pole bean seed, sweet corn seed, mangel beet seed and turnip seed.

Yamhill, Polk, Benton, Marion, Linn and Lane are among the leading counties of the entire nation in production of snap bean seed.

Washington, Clackamas and Marion are among the leading counties of the nation in production of onion seeds and onion sets.

Yamhill, Benton, Lane and Douglas are among the leading counties in the production of pumpkin seed.

Daylight Saving Loses.

Washington, Aug. 20.—Repeal of the daylight saving act was accomplished today, the senate voting to sustain the house in passing the repeal measure over President Wilson's veto. The vote was 57 to 19.

The repeal of the law becomes effective after the clocks are turned back to normal in October. It is one of the very few measures which have twice been vetoed by the president and have become laws in spite of the veto.
