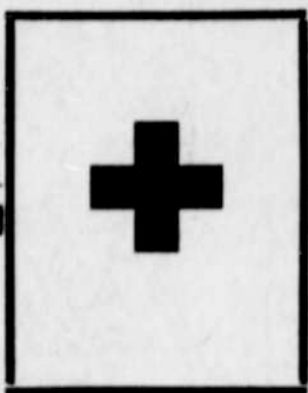

CORPORATION COMMISSIONER WARNS AGAINST PURCHASE OF ANY UNKNOWN STOCKS

The following warning has been issued by H. J. Schulderman, corporation commissioner:

The law commonly known as the blue sky law regarding the sale of corporate stocks and securities (chapter 341 General Laws of Oregon of 1913, as amended) provides that no person, partnership, corporation or association (except those specifically exempted under the provisions of that act) shall sell or offer for sale in Oregon any stocks, bonds, notes, contracts or other securities of whatsoever kind or character, without being first licensed so to do by the corporation commissioner of the state of Oregon.

Any sales or offers made in violation of this law are crimes and punishable by fine of not more than \$5000 or by imprisonment in the state penitentiary for not more than five years, or by both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court.

The public is cautioned to ascertain if the companies whose securities are being offered and the agent offering the same have been duly licensed by the corporation commissioner, and to be sure that the agent is not selling at a higher price than fixed by the company in its application and allowed by the commissioner. The corporation commissioner does not recommend the purchase nor in any way guarantee or warrant any securities, the sale of which is licensed. Therefore, the public is cautioned to investigate for itself before investing.

The corporation commissioner will be glad to furnish such information regarding agents, dealers, companies and securities as the facilities of his office and the law will permit. The public is requested to report any and all violations of this law to the corporation commissioner of this state. Any representations made that because a license has been granted by the commissioner that such securities are good investment is a gross misrepresentation and should be reported.

Legion Post Backs Johnson.

Klamath Falls, Ore., Oct. 17.—Endorsement of the stand of Senator Hiram Johnson on the league of nations covenant was expressed by Klamath Falls post No. 8 of the American Legion in the following resolution:

"Resolved by Klamath post No. 8 of the American Legion that the post favors the amendment offered by Senator Hiram Johnson to the league of nations covenant, which seeks to equalize the voting power of the United States and Great Britain in the league of nations; and, be it further

"Resolved, that we stand for a 100 per cent Americanism and that we do not concede superiority over the United States to any nation in the world."

Mining Exemption to Be Extended.

An amendment has been introduced in congress to further extend the law regarding exemption of assessment work on mining claims. The law recently enacted, which was an extension of a former law, specified that the exemption would apply to but five claims owned by any one person or corporation. The new amendment would extend the exemption to a greater number of claims.
