Use Second Speed on Crossings.

Many accidents would be avoided if
the driver of the automobile when ap-
proaching a railroad grade crossing
would shift to second speed, keep his
feet on the clutch and foot brake, and
feed with his hand, keeping the tro-
tle far enough advanced to assure am-
ple power in the engine, especially
when necessary to ascend a grade over
the crossing. In stopping in front of a
crossing the machine should be suffi-
ciently in the clear to allow a train to
pass without swiping it.
