O. & C. GRANT LANDS TO BE THROWN OPEN

Department of Interior Postpones Date to Early Spring for Convenience of Claimants.

The department of the interior is planning to open the remainder of the agricultural lands in the O. & C. land grant early next spring. Maps and data will be ready probably in January so that those planning to take up any of this land may get the necessary information in advance.

In a letter to Congressman Hawley the department states that the opening could be held earlier except that it would bring the time into the middle of winter, when it would be inconvenient for settlers to go onto the lands. The Coos Bay grant lands will be included in the same opening.

Water Users Not Inconvenienced.
Patrons of the city water system were in no way inconvenienced by the shutting off of the water from the east reservoir Wednesday for the purpose of cleaning the reservoir. The Silk creek reservoir was able to furnish water in sufficient quantity for all the needs of the city.

NEW COUNTY AGENT IS MAN OF MANY TALENTS

After a long and careful search for a well qualified successor to N. S. Robb, former county agricultural agent of Lane county, Ira Parker Whitney, of Spokane, Wash., has been selected from many applicants and will report for duty December 1, 1919.

Mr. Whitney is a married man, 38 years of age, and was raised in the Willamette valley, having spent several years on his father's farm in Linn and Lincoln counties. He graduated from the Oregon Agricultural college in 1905. From 1905 to 1910 he was instructor in the dairy department of the Washington state college, and while in that position became widely known in dairy circles throughout the northwest. He was very successful in institute work and very influential in dairy conventions.

For the past ten years Mr. Whitney has been manager of the Waikiki stock farms, near Spokane, owned by J. C. Graves. During this period Mr. Whitney has been successful in building up one of the best dairy herds in the western part of the United States and has made remarkable production and show records.

Mr. Whitney has been chairman of the agricultural committee of the Spokane chamber of commerce and at the present time is superintendent of the dairy show, in which 1000 dairy animals have been entered. Up to the present time this is the largest show that has been held in the west.

According to the Oregon Agricultural college, Mr. Whitney is one of the very strongest men who has ever entered the county agent service in the state.
